



AED: The quotation received from St John Ambulance of £1557.00 (this includes the VAT) was accepted and the order with payment has been sent. The AED will be fixed on the wall at The Swan Pub and will be able to use their electricity (by kind permission of Mr & Mrs Williams).

S106 funds: Following the research carried out for costs of the project, this has now been settled and agreed. The next step now is to complete the form to request the funds and send to Babergh D.C.

Neighbourhood Plan: This is now going through the first stages and the first Consultation Evening will be on the 21st November (more details next month). You can look on the P.C. website where there is information and a link to the Neighbourhood Plan Facebook page.

Textile Bank: As the P.C. had not received any payment from these Banks, the Clerk contacted ERC and they had no record of any textile banks in Lawshall. The Clerk then contacted Babergh D.C. and they had no record of these banks either! Further investigation was made and the Banks had been registered with St. Edmundsbury Borough Council and the payment had been made to them! Now the Banks are registered with Babergh D.C. and they have the information to hand that 1.30 tonnes has been collected and this comes to £319.83 and this will be paid to the P.C. from Babergh D.C. and then they will claim this money back from St. Eds.

The Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations, 2012

Babergh Council has received an application from Lawshall Parish Council to designate a **Neighbourhood Area**. If designated, it will enable the Parish Council to produce a Neighbourhood Development Plan for Lawshall. Once complete (it may take 18-24 months to produce) the Plan will be used by Babergh Council to determine planning applications within the area.

Why are we consulting?

Babergh Council must consult for at least four weeks before making a decision to designate the proposed neighbourhood planning area. Any comments received will be considered and the decision will be published on its website.

Any comments should focus on whether the area is **appropriate** to be used for Lawshall's Neighbourhood Plan. For example if there is a group of properties that are bisected by the boundary you may consider that they should be included or excluded from the area.

How to respond

The neighbourhood area designation application, map, and supporting statement are available online at www.babergh.gov.uk/planning-and-building/community-led-planning/neighbourhood-development-plans/neighbourhood-planning-in-lawshall

Alternatively, paper copies are available for inspection at the Council Offices, Corks Lane, Hadleigh, Ipswich, IP7 6SJ.

The consultation period will finish at 4:00pm on 1 December 2015.

Comments can be submitted either by email to nhp@babergh.gov.uk or by post, addressed to: Nicholas Ward, Corporate Manager - Community Planning, Heritage & Design, Council Offices, Corks Lane, Hadleigh, Ipswich, IP7 6SJ. Please note that your comments will be kept on a public file and they may be reproduced.

Babergh Council is only consulting on the <u>area</u> proposed by Lawshall Parish Council. If you have any questions about the Neighbourhood Development Plan process or want to get involved please contact the Parish Council.

Bird Notes November 2015 by Cliff Cooper

Early October saw our (almost) annual autumn birding break in north Norfolk. True to form, we slightly missed the best of the birding weather! There had been a long dry spell before we went and some strong, cold easterly winds were predicted, so we went prepared for the cold, hoping for some good birds brought in from the east. Well it rained most of the time we were there and the beneficial winds arrived just as we left, but we still managed to see 87 species (compared to 96 last year).

I did manage to find one "good" bird though- a yellow-browed warbler. This tiny warbler is not much bigger than a goldcrest and flies here from Siberia. It used to be really rare here in the UK, but gradually autumn sightings have become more regular. Some experts put this down to the gradual increase in world temperatures for whatever reason; others believe it to be due to the westward range expansion of the species. I don't really have enough knowledge of the subject to form an opinion, I just know that the yellow-browed is a very welcome bird and I would be very happy if indeed it did start to breed here.

Back home it has been pleasing to see up to 14 yellowhammers in a small flock along the hedgerow during my walks. This is probably the result of two successful nests close by this year. Also, the skylarks seem to have done well despite the poor summer and vast numbers of woodpigeons and rooks are trying to undo the farmers' efforts to get next year's crops underway.

I knew the first fieldfares had arrived back in Lawshall by 15th October when I saw a flock of about 50 flying over Hartest lane chattering away as they went.





'From the Archives' November 2015

At the moment we are cataloguing and reference the 'People' section of the Archives. Over the years we have got a lot of individuals on file. Most of the information has come from newspaper cuttings and, of course, it is usually people who have made a name for themselves through their work of some actions they have taken that have made a difference to the local community. You will be forgiven for not knowing the name of John Brereton as he was in Lawshall in 1598 when he was the Curate at All Saints' Church. When he was in Suffolk he met an adventurer called Gosnold and John travelled with him to Virginia which was to become New

England.



On this journey John wrote an account of the exploration of Cape Cod in the 'New World' and when his account was published in 1602 it helped promote the possibilities of English colonization in what was then known as 'the North part of Virginia'.


Eight sailors and 24 gentlemen sailed to America in a small ship called the Concord, half the gentlemen planned to settle in this unknown country, but Brereton returned, wrote his account and then lived a quiet life as a Rector in Brightwell near Ipswich and then in Norwich. He died in 1632 aged about 64 years.

If only he had written an account of Lawshall during his time here. I often wish there was time to follow up all the leads there are in the archives. Maybe somewhere in some library or family archive there is an account written by John. At this time we can only imagine Lawshall over 400 years ago. On the left is the front cover of his account.

Summary of Lawshall Weather September/October 2015

To coincide with magazine copy and print dates, the following information has been compiled from data taken from 19th September to 18th October

Average Day Temperature in °C: 16.7 (2014: 18.4) *Stowmarket Av. 14.2

Average Night Temperature in °C: 9.2 (2014: 10.5) *Stowmarket Av. 7.5

Highest Temperature in °C: 19.8 on the 20th & 27th September.

(**2014**: 26.3 on the 19th September)

Lowest Temperature in °C: 7.2 on 12th October. (**2014**: 6.1 on 3rd October)

Average Temperature in °C: 12.9 (2014: 14.5)

Total Rainfall in mm: 28 (2014: 126) *Stowmarket Av. 64.8

Days of rainfall over 0.5mm 6 (2014:11) *Stowmarket Av. 10

*Stowmarket average taken from Met. Office data over the 30 years 1981–2010

All readings are taken in the open but not in direct sunlight so that a true 'Air Temperature' is recorded at all times.

General Comments:

<u>Weather</u>: Once again, the daily average temperature is well below the figures of last year but still showing an increase on the Stowmarket average. Night time figures are down on last year although above the Stowmarket average.

Rainfall: On the 19th September last year we had 48mm of rain in the one day leading to all the troubles in our village and at the Village Hall. This figure was nearly double the entire monthly rainfall this year – IN ONE SINGLE DAY! However, rainfall figures now tell their own story. During the first nine months of this year – to the19th October– **468 mm** of rain has fallen as against **728 mm** in the same period last year.

<u>Summary of the year to date:</u> Weather across the UK in general, has been very good, with early season rain leading to higher than normal summer temperatures. East Anglia, however, has been considerably colder with a lot less rain than normal. The second half of September and first half of October have shown a marked improvement in temperatures, with some long sunny days although still very little rainfall. Even so, the average daily temperature for us during this period has been nearly two degrees down on last year.
