- We've all worked hard and come together as a community to make the NP Submission what it is – a document that represents the views of the villagers. Now come the next official steps:
- Babergh's public consultation ends on Friday 31st March at 4pm. Don't forget you can still send in comments to Babergh before this time (details on our website).
- From 3rd April an administrator from Babergh's Planning Department will pulling all the documents together and sending them to an Independent Examiner.
- It's hoped the plan's examination will take place directly after Easter and take around two weeks.
- The Plan will then come back to us along with the Examiner's requests for final adjustments or amendments.
- The NP team will then work on producing the Final Plan, taking these requests into account.
- Babergh will announce the date for the Neighbourhood Plan Referendum. We hope this will be in June.

We'll be asking for your support one last time – to come out and vote!

Bird Notes April 2017 by Cliff Cooper

Nature's cycle has come quickly round to Spring again, and the signs are all around us in the village. Recently there has been quite a lot of bird movement associated with this change in the season.

Whilst out walking the fields a few days ago I spotted a small flock of waders flying overhead; I was really pleased to see them drop lower and circle the field I was walking round before they dropped to the ground and I could see that they were golden plovers. It was a relatively small flock of about fifty birds, but these birds will be on their way north to the high ground for their breeding season. Heading in roughly the same northerly direction will be the flock of about a hundred redwings that I also noticed recently.

You don't have to leave the village to see slightly scarcer birds at this time of year- you just have to be lucky - like my near neighbour who had a black redstart visit his garden as it passed through. Similarly, I was literally surprised to come across a woodcock just behind the village hall; it got up from right under my feet and really made me jump.

The black-headed gulls have regained their summer plumage now, so they look at a distance like their name suggests. However, on closer inspection, you can see that the head is not really black at all – it is a dark chocolate brown. Perhaps a mistake by the early ornithologists who didn't have the benefit of our modern high quality optical equipment?

The first of the warblers to arrive here in Lawshall is usually the Chiffchaff and this year was no exception. Unfortunately for me, I was beaten to the sound of the first one this year by Pauline and Dennis Morgan who heard one in Golden Wood on the fifteenth of March. I didn't hear mine until the next day!





Lawshall Community Woodlands

A Forest for Our Children

A TREE FOR EVERY CHILD

At Golden Wood, that's our aim. Trees take time to grow. They're strong and surprising. They need to be nurtured. And every one is different. You never know which way they're going to grow.

Like our woodlands, our children are our future. They'll be here after we're gone. Which is why Forest for Our Children runs the Seed to Tree programme, led by Elizabeth Clarke along with a team of volunteers from the school and the FOC, to pass on what we know about woodland management and to keep the wood's link with Papua New Guinea alive.

Every Autumn, children from Y1 search for acorns (and other seeds) which are then planted in the Tree Nursery behind All Saints School. In Y2, the children mind and mulch the saplings. Two years later and the saplings are ready to be planted out in Golden Wood, so every child has their tree.

For the past two years, the children have used their trees to plant the hedgerow along the North-West boundary of the upper wood, near The Foundry.

The very first tree was planted in the school grounds by William Takaku in 1993 when he was visiting Lawshall from the rainforest of Papua New Guinea. The children's connection with trees is kept alive in the names of their classes: Acorn, Oak, Ash, Lime, Horse Chestnut, Willow and Elder. So hopefully you can now see why our woodland is called 'Forest for Our Children'.

Lawshall Weather Summary February 2017

Well, what a strange month this has been. The first week was quite warm for this time of year. The second week became colder as it progressed until the **10**th when we had some snow flurries leading to the first light snow fall on the **11**th. Snow did not settle and was gone by the evening. We then had a changeable but unseasonably warm patch up to the **20**th when the temperature reached 16.6°c. This was followed by some strong winds that lead to 'Storm Doris' hitting us on the **23**rd. Gale force winds gusted to over 80mph but luckily for us did only superficial damage mostly to trees. **24**th – **28**th remained changeable but above average temperatures. Rainfall for the month was well up on last year and above Met. Office averages for the period.

Rainfall was 49mm. 2016 – 18mm. (41mm). *UK National Average* 36mm.

Average daytime temp 8.3° c 2016 was 5.5° c (6.8° c) *UK National Average* 7.6° c

Highest Temperature was 16.6°c on the 20th. 2016 was 13.9°c.

Average night-time temp. 4.8° c. $(0.8^{\circ}$ c). *UK National Average* 2.5° c Lowest Temperature was 0.5° c on the 10^{th} . 2016 was -1.3°c.
