Key Facts About the Neighbourhood Plan Referendum

For two years the Neighbourhood Plan Team have been working on behalf of the Parish Council to engage the village in the development of a Neighbourhood Plan for Lawshall. It's now over to you to decide whether the Plan should pass. With the referendum on Thursday 19th October 2017 at the Village Hall it's a good time to remind ourselves of some key facts.

What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

- ② A Neighbourhood Plan is a community-led framework for guiding the future of development in an area
- ☑ Neighbourhood Plans were introduced as part of a governmental drive towards 'Localism', handing powers over from government to local areas
- ② A Neighbourhood Plan is developed by the community. Lawshall's Plan is based on what the community have said through community consultation events, the village questionnaire, the housing needs survey and a number of other activities documented in the Plan.

What happens if the referendum goes in favour of the Neighbourhood Plan?

- Babergh District Council will pass the Neighbourhood Plan into planning law
- ☑ Future planning applications in Lawshall will be judged against the policies contained in the Plan until the year 2036
- ② Lawshall Parish Council will receive a larger cut of funds raised by any new builds in the village. Currently the PC gets 15% of funds from the 'Community Infrastructure Levy' to spend on local needs. With an NP this figure goes up to 25%

What are the policies in the Neighbourhood Plan?

- There are 16 policies in the Neighbourhood Plan. The contents page of the Plan tells you where each policy can be found. They include:
- Policies regarding where housing would and would not be permissible, how many houses are permissible within a site and what kind of houses are appropriate given Lawshall's needs
- Policies regarding the protection of biodiversity, recreation spaces, green spaces, environmental assets and areas of local landscape sensitivity
- Policies regarding the sensitivity of any new houses to the existing character of Lawshall
- Policies regarding facilities, services and infrastructure in the village including a policy concerning flood risk management

The Lawshall Trust

There are two trusts in the village administered by the Lawshall Trustees. They each get funds form dividends on investments, which arise as a result of bequests of land and money left to the people of Lawshall throughout its history.

For example the Village Hall was built on "Town Lands" which was left to the village in this way.



Bird Notes October 2017 by Cliff Cooper

Despite some strange, and at times awful, weather this summer the birds seem to have done rather well in terms of breeding success. I have no scientific evidence to support this statement, but it just appears to me that there are plenty of young birds of quite a few species around the village.

The starling group that comes to our garden for a morning feed every day has grown to about sixty noisy, messy individuals. The young birds have not yet developed their star-spangled plumage so it is relatively easy to separate the young birds from the old.

House martins, which I feared were going to struggle this year, also seem to have recovered later in the summer- I was still seeing up to twenty of them flying over the Glebe area in mid-September; swallows also seem to be quite numerous as they gather on the telegraph wires in preparation for their flight to Africa.

In the fields around the village I have noted a flock of linnets which numbered well over sixty- a sign that things can't be too bad on our farmland. Another indicator species to show the wildlife health of the land is the yellowhammer; we seem to be doing very well here also as they are plentiful along the hedgerows, whereas countrywide they are in serious decline.

The birds of prey, being right at the top of the food chain, also give a good indication of the state of the wildlife. The more food there is for them, the better their breeding success, so if we see lots of kestrels, sparrowhawks,

buzzards, owls, and now even kites we know that the land is providing their prey in sufficient quantity to support them. This is very much the case locally, so keep it up Lawshall farmers and we can have a future to look forward to.

Post Script:

After a busy morning gardening in the sunshine, we were sitting in our back garden eating lunch on Tuesday, 19th September, when we heard the call of a buzzard. To our

surprise we look up to find not just one, but five buzzards circling above us. This is the most we've ever seen and presumed it was the parent birds with their three offspring from this year - would this be correct do you think Cliff Cooper?

<u>Lawshall Weather Summary – August 2017</u>

This month I thought it would be a change to offer a slightly different format. The figures below are for the month of August but these are followed by data taken over the last five years for the period January – August.

August:

Total Rainfall was 78mm. In 2016 we had 29mm. Stowmarket Av. 56mm Average daytime temperature was 22.1°c. In 2016 it was 24.5°c. Stowmarket 21.8°c Highest Temp was 28.1°c on the 28th. In 2016 it was 33.6°c on the 24th.

Average night-time temp was 13.4°c. In 2016 it was 13.1°c. Stowmarket 12.2°c Lowest Temp was 9.5°c on the 31st. In 2016 it was 10.8°c on the 8th.

Stowmarket figures where shown are averaged over the last ten years.

It is often said that our weather is changing. General opinion says that day and night temperatures are warmer than they used to be and rainfall has dropped. The figures below show <u>average temperatures</u> from January to August in each of the last five years. Highest and lowest temperatures are <u>actual one-off day or night readings</u> during the eight month period. All figures are shown in °c. Rainfall shows the total amount in the eight months.

This data shows the last five years here in Lawshall. Whilst there are no vast differences it can be seen that this year to date shows the highest average temperatures both by day and night. The overall highest one day temperature was in 2016 but the lowest was in 2013. Rainfall is surprising because the highest total by a long way was in 2014 with the next highest this year.
