Bird Notes June 2018 by Cliff Cooper

The weather was certainly not on our side when we made our annual spring trip to north Norfolk for a few days birding in mid-May. In fact it was so cold with a northerly wind blowing that it really felt more like December than May. This unseasonal weather was reflected in our bird species count- we only recorded 82 species this time, whereas last spring we counted 101 species over the same period. The woodland birds had nothing to sing about and the wind was making our eyes run when we tried to look for seabirds. Nevertheless, we always enjoy our walks along the Norfolk coast, so we just wrapped up as best we could and got on with it!

We didn't see any real rarities this time, although we did spot two spoonbillsone when we saw them; interestingly the second bird appeared to be carrying soat Blakeney and the other not too far away at Stiffkey. Both birds were in flight me sort of nesting material- either grass or straw hanging from its great long bill.

Back home now to a slightly warmer climate! Our artificial house martin nests are being completely ignored by the martins, though it is fair to say that at present they are not showing any sign of nesting anywhere nearby. I have not seen more than 5 martins over us so far this year, a bit disappointing, but two of these birds came and landed on our roof just where the parent birds fed their two youngsters last year after the nest fell down. Perhaps these two birds could be last year's babies?

As I feared, the starlings in the nest by our bedroom window are making a lot of noise, early in the morning and late at night. I bet that hole gets blocked off once they have fledged!

Our Lady Immaculate and St Joseph's Catholic Church.

Many people drive past the small white church and cottage that sit alongside the Bury Road without realising their historic significance and role in the history of the Roman Catholic Church in Suffolk.



The small mission church is part of the Roman Catholic parish of St Edmund King and Martyr in Bury St Edmunds, but the history of the little church is much older than the parish itself and is very much rooted in the history of the village. Consequently, it is considered the oldest Catholic Church in Suffolk.

The church's history is linked to Coldham Hall, hence the name of the priest's cottage remains 'Coldham Cottage'. The Rookwood family who built Coldham in 1574 had lived in the area since the 14th Century and during the Elizabethan Reformation continued to provide a home for priests and a space for mass to be said, despite the danger this presented to them and those who chose to openly practise their faith in this way at the time.

At various points over the following centuries the Rookwood family built secret chapels hidden on their estate and continued not only to practise the Roman Catholic faith, but also provide a large proportion of the local community who shared this belief the means to practise their faith. This seems to have continued throughout the periods when this was a punishable offence if caught. The exact date of the buildings now known as 'Our Lady Immaculate and St Joseph' and Coldham Cottage on the Bury Road is not known, but it seems that the original building was built before the 17th Century as a home for priests on the Coldham Estate. In the 19th century, when Roman Catholics were once again openly free to practise their faith, the building was extended and in 1870 religious services moved permanently into the cottage with one end serving as the church and the other as the priest's home (as it currently does today). By the 1830's a Catholic school had been built alongside the church. The school was very popular and continued until 1949 when students transferred to the larger Catholic schools in Bury St Edmunds and the building was demolished. All that remains of the school today are the tiny benches that were used in the classrooms which became the pews still in use in the church.

To those of us who worship at the church, it is a key part of our community and a thriving continuation of the longstanding legacy of Catholicism in our area. To the wider community the building presents a special part of the history of the village and an insight into changing attitudes to faith over the centuries.
