

Window now open to apply for Primary and Secondary school places: (info received from Ccllr R. Kemp): Parents and carers can now apply for primary and secondary school places for September 2019. The deadline for applications to secure a place at a Suffolk secondary school is Wednesday 31 October 2018. and for a primary school it is Wednesday 15 January 2019. Secondary schools include high schools and upper schools and primary schools includes infant, junior and middle schools. This year, parents and carers will also need to consider the changes to Suffolk's School Travel Policy, which were agreed by Suffolk County Council's Cabinet on 19 June 2018. The new policy will assess eligibility for funded school travel to the nearest suitable school with a place available. More information about the changes is available at www.suffolk.gov.uk/admissions

Parents and carers should apply online at www.suffolk.gov.uk/ admissions as they will receive confirmation that their application has been received. If for any reason parents and carers are unable to apply on line they should apply on a paper CAF1 application form. Bird Notes November 2018 By Cliff Cooper

A few days ago, whilst taking a leisurely stroll round Golden wood. I stopped to watch two red kites as they swooped and swirled across the sky- easily avoiding the mobbing tactics of the local rooks. At the time I didn't think much of this encounter because the kites have become regulars around the village now. Back home. I started to think back to the early 1970s when I went with a more experienced birding friend to Tregarron in Mid-Wales to try to find a red kite; at that time there were only 23 pairs of breeding kites in the UK (none in England). We were lucky on that day and I saw my first almost mythical red kite.



The recovery of the kite population has been remarkable, due to a change in attitudes towards birds of prey, better use and understanding of the effects of pesticides on our land, and help from a young bird release scheme in some areas of the country.

Similarly, the ravens I mentioned last month that I had seen in Derbyshire would not have been there 40 odd years ago. They have gradually spread further and further down from their mountain strongholds- they have even bred in Suffolk this year.

Other success stories are probably due more to the changes in our climate than anything we have done directly to help them. Two examples of this are the Cetti's warbler and the little egret- both on the edge of the area where they can survive the winters without the need to migrate. These two species are now quite common throughout the country, certainly in the southern parts, but again my memory goes back to long trips in my youth to find these rarities in Devon and Sussex.

Of course, along with these successes there are also many struggles where some species are just clinging on to their homes here, but that is a story for another day.

LAWSHALL GARDEN CLUB

I was chatting to a colleague at work this week and they said how they hate this time of year as everything is dying and all we have to look forward to is cold weather. I suppose we all see seasons in different ways as I love the autumn with all its colours and fresh scents. Plants aren't dying; they are simply preparing for winter very much like we do. It's a great time to get out and about and see the wonderful displays of reds and golds and to breathe in the lovely fresh crisp air. It is also time for a number of jobs in our gardens.

* As the trees shed their leaves, we should be collecting them up and storing them to make leaf mould. You can mix it with your garden compost or store it in bin bags or make an enclosure with chicken wire and stuff it all in. Leave it to rot down until next autumn when it will have broken down and smell fresh and clean. It's good as a mulch for acid loving plants and to break down soil that is compacted or mixed with general compost to use as potting compost. If you are filling bin bags, it is a good idea to dampen the leaves and punch small holes in the bag.

* It is also the right time to prune some fruit trees and bushes, but not all!

* Apple trees can be pruned from November onwards as can Pear trees, blackberries, gooseberries and kiwis. Cut back to healthy buds on the apples and
pears using clean, sharp tools. Cut back the strongest side-shoots to 2 or 3

buds for a strong blossom and a bumper crop next year. Gooseberries need
the oldest fruited branches cut down to ground level leaving a core of up to
seven young stems to fruit next year. Try to create a goblet shape where possible to allow light into the plant next spring. All blackberry canes that have
fruited this year should also be cut back to ground level.

☆ It is important that you do not prune plums, damsons, cherries, forsythia and ☆ abutilons at this time of year as you may risk them being infected by silver leaf ☆ disease. I will let you know the best time to prune these as the time ap- ☆ proaches.

* That's it for now. Enjoy your gardens and I will be back next month.






SUNDAY 11TH NOVEMBER 2018

We have many reminders in the village of those men who died in the First World War and we

remember all those who have died in all the subsequent wars. On Sunday 11th November we will be meeting at the Memorial Stone on Bury Road at 10am to begin our day of Remembrance. We will remember Johannes Van Mesdag the Dutch pilot who died on 6th March 1945. Later at All Saints Church at 10.45 we will read the names of all those other men from the village who died in both world wars. There will be some information about some of the men on display and you will be most welcome to join us on this significant day in our history. Another reminder of these men is in the pub where the following inscription can be seen.

"The Lawshall Swan remembrance coins. Before the 1st WW, villagers nailed these coins into one of the original oak beams for collection upon their return. Those that are left here are from brave men that sadly did not return. We shall not forget them. "

The Church clock is also a reminder of these men as it was put up in memory of the twenty four men who died in the First World War.

Follow these simple tips to keep warm and safe this winter.

- **1. Wrap up warm:** Dress in layers and wear a hat, gloves and scarf. Clothes made from wool, cotton or fleecy fabrics are warmest. When you're indoors, wear warm socks and slippers to keep your feet cosy.
- **2. Keep the cold out**: lose doors and use a keyhole cover to block draughts. Buy thermal linings for curtains to keep the heat in.
- **3. Don't use alcohol to keep warm:** Avoid drinking alcohol before going, or when, outside. It makes you feel warm because blood vessels in the skin expand, but this draws heat away from your vital organs.
- **4. Check your heating:** Have your heating system serviced regularly to make sure it works well.
- **5. Maintain the temperature**: Keep your main living room at 18–21°C (64–70°F) and the rest of your house at 16°C (61°F) at least. If you can't heat all the rooms you use, heat the living room during the day and the bedroom just before you go to sleep. In bed, use either a hot water bottle or an electric blanket.


