#### Parish Council Report www.lawshall.suffolk.gov.uk

Parish Infrastructure Investment Plans (PIIPs) and Community Infrastructure Levy (C.I.L.): In last month's magazine the P.C. asked for project suggestions for PIIPs. At the P.C. meeting on the 8th January it was suggested that an explanation for this would help residents to understand a bit more about it. This is a new venture for the P.C. and we are still learning about it!

The "pot" for C.I.L.(money paid by developers for new dwellings), is allocated: 5% BDC admin; 25% to villages with a Neighbourhood Plan, the remaining 70% is for C.I.L. "bids" (C123).

Parish councils can "bid" for future investment in the village but to do this Lawshall has to have a PIIP in place and it has to be registered with BDC. If any bid is in conjunction with a neighbouring village this could be an advantage. If you have any suggestions for future investment in the village please contact the Clerk or any Councillor.

Dog fouling: It has been reported that this is occurring around the walkways in the village. May we please ask all dog owners to clear up after their dogs, and a reminder that this is a punishable offence with a large fine.

#### Bird Notes February 2019 By Cliff Cooper

On 14<sup>th</sup> January we paid our first visit of 2019 to Lackford Lakes. It was a cold morning, but clear and bright so we could see the birds out on the large boating lake really nicely. There was a large gathering of various duck species on the lake - the highlight was a pair of goldeneye quite close to us. The male looked spectacular with his black and white plumage and bright orange eyes. We counted six other species of duck on the lake as well as three types of goose plus coots, moorhen and mute swans.

Moving round to the shallower waters of the Slough, we encountered lots of teal, gulls (mainly black-headed), and a sizeable flock of lapwings. Again, the teal looked so crisp and bright in the sunshine: very pretty little ducks that are so easy to overlook along the banks of the water.

Next we walked through the woodland area where we saw and heard what seemed like hundreds of great tits, all calling and singing to make their presence felt by the others around them.

It was also pleasing to note quite a few chaffinches throughout the reserve as their numbers seemed to have been dwindling in recent years. All the males are now starting to look their best ready for the start of the breeding season.

Moving on to the large lakes beyond Fuller's Mill, we came across at least four little grebes, yet we didn't find a great crested grebe (perhaps they had all gone to the seaside for a break?). Of course there was the now ubiquitous little egret to complete the picture.

We spent about two hours on the reserve and saw forty five species of bird in that time. The impression we got was that there appeared to be more birds in general around the area, whether that is due to the mild winter or good management is a matter of conjecture.

#### **Lawshall Garden Club**

Hi there fellow garden enthusiasts. It's the middle of January as I write this and it has not been too bad weather wise so far. There is the threat of another 'Beast from the East' apparently, sometime during late February to March. We can only wait and see.

The other day, I took a stroll around my garden to see what was happening. It was really useful as I was able to identify jobs that needed to be addressed later in the spring and with the garden being mainly open at this time of year, I also came up with new ideas for replenishing borders and moving existing plants that didn't fair quite so well last year. I noticed some areas of grass that needed repairing and marked them off with canes ready for seeding or turfing in March. One bed that has struggled will be moved due to the close proximity of a number of conifers that swallow up all the moisture from the soil. My walk helped me to identify a new area to replace this border.

I have a new circular bed that I have been designing in my head and I took the opportunity to plant a number of bare root Beech hedging plants around the northern half of the bed. This is a good time of year for planting bare root plants although it is best to avoid frosty days if possible. By planting these, I have created a micro climate, protecting the new plants that I am planning, from cold north winds. Among the plants I would like to plant there are some ornamental grasses. Having not had much success with these in the past, I have started an on line course on designing with grasses and the care necessary to keep them healthy. This course is only £29 and has been really useful so far. You can get some great advice and courses on line and now is an ideal time to start if you are able to do so.

Talking of advice, the Lawshall Garden Club will be at the Lawshall Village Hall on **Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> January at 7pm**, where will be enjoying a talk by an expert on pruning. This is an ideal time to think about pruning and so many of us need help and advice on what to prune, how and when. If you fancy joining us then please come along. Your first visit to the club is free and if you enjoy it you can join the club and learn more about all aspects of gardening from a variety of experts. There's also free tea, coffee and biscuits. For more information, give me a call on 07783 076332. I look forward to seeing you there.

Hello from your Lawshall WI.

Although the exact age of the Guildhall is unknown, it's thought to be around 900 years old, making it the oldest civic building in England. It was built for the guilds by the Abbot of St Edmundsbury. However, the rents charged to the townspeople of Bury were onerous and sometime in the



1400's John (known as Jankyn) Smyth purchased the building from the monastery. It was his bequest, along with that of Margaret Odeham and others that established the Guildhall Feoffement Trust. Restoration on the Guildhall was completed in July 2018 with help from the Lottery Fund.

In February, instead of our usual meeting, we are attending a performance of Calendar Girls in Norwich. We are a friendly bunch and would love to welcome any new members. You are welcome to come along as a non-member to see what we are about. The WI is a great way to make new friends and explore new interests. 



As of last week (9 January), companies that make unsolicited phone calls to people about their pensions will be liable to enforcement action, including fines of upto £500,000.

The ban has been introduced in a bid to prevent people falling victim to cold call scams that can lead to them losing their life savings.

As many as eight scam calls take place every second - or a whopping 250 million calls a year – according to research from the Money Advice Service (MAS).

Victims of pension scams can lose their life savings, and be left facing retirement with limited income. According to the Financial Conduct Authority, pension fraudsters stole on average £91,000 per victim in 2018.

If you receive a cold call about your pension, get any information you can, such as the company name or phone number, and report it to <a href="the Information Commissioner's Office via their website">their website</a> or on 0303 123 1113.

It can be seen from the above that January to April were in line with average figures but May saw a rise in temperature that coincided with the drop in rainfall. The lovely summer weather from May all through to September was the reason why average annual day temperatures rose from 15.4 in 2017 to 16.1 in 2018 and rainfall fell from 53mm last year to 45mm this year. 2019 appears to be following the warmer pattern but time will soon show us if this is a trend or merely a weather blip.
