**School Bus policy changes:** S.C.C. is implementing changes to its School Travel Policy taking effect from **September 2019**. Children living in Suffolk starting at a new school will be eligible for SCC funded school travel when they are over 2 miles (under 8 yrs old) or 3 miles (over 8) walking distance from their nearest school that would have had a place available for them. This would be whether or not an application was made for a place at that school. Full details about SCC funded school travel, including additional arrangements for low income families and those with special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) can be found at www.suffolkonboard.com/schooltravel

For transport in September 2019 and all future years families whose children are eligible for SCC funded school travel **will need to opt-in to receive their transport.** 

This important change means that **all** parents will have to opt-in **by 31 May each year** for school travel to be provided in the following school year as this will no longer be provided automatically. This a brief notice of school travel, if you would like to see the email the Clerk received about school travel which includes more information, please get in touch.

**Dog fouling reminder:** Please clear up after your dogs in all areas in the village including the footpaths and all walkways available for you. Please take notice of this reminder as **not** clearing up after your dogs is a punishable offence with a substantial fine.

#### 2 reports on or near Windsor Close:

1) includes damage to buildings and vehicles and deliberate damage by fire. Under investigation.

## Bird Notes March 2019 by Cliff Cooper

Owls seem to have featured highly in my recent sightings. Tawny owls are calling constantly at night from the fields around us, and I have seen one or two in the car headlights. The barn owls are regular visitors on the Green at Hawstead as well as a pair being noted from Lawshall Green. My most unusual sighting locally was a short –eared owl which sprang from the ground not far in front of me; I suspect it had caught a mouse or vole and was devouring it until I came along and spoiled the feast. The only disappointment is that I have not seen a little owl at the top of Bull's hill near Nowton where they used to be regular. Has anyone seen them there, please?

On a walk at St. Helens picnic area (Santon Downham) we found the flock of bramblings in the beech trees, and we also no saw a nice bright kingfisher on the river. People had reported a great grey shrike in that area, but we didn't find it!

What we have noticed as we go on our various walks is that the number of chaffinches seems to be on the increase again- even in Golden wood we have seen as many as twelve at one time; we often didn't see one at all previously. Maybe this is due to milder winters, or on such a small sample it could be simply coincidence.

Also in Golden wood we saw two pairs of bullfinches together in the area where we usually see just one pair. A buzzard also appears to

have taken up residence in the wood as he\she is there every time we visit.

An opportunity too good to miss- we had to make a journey into town to see the waxwings that were staying around Tavern lane near the bus station. We nearly missed the six of them as they were sitting up on a TV ariel , trying to look like starlings !

## Lawshall Garden Club

March sees the arrival of spring in our gardens. We've spent a couple of months watching and waiting for the time to come when we can get back to some serious gardening. Although last year saw the dreaded 'beast from the east' hitting us hard this month, generally this is the month when the soil starts to warm up and we can start sowing and planting in earnest.

We can begin by sowing hardy annual seeds under cover in a greenhouse or on a window sill. Earlier planted seedlings such as sweet peas will need pricking out this month to encourage bushier growth and more flowers. Beds can be made ready for direct sowing towards the end of the month and into April. Summer flowering bulbs such as crocosmia, lillies, freesias and gladioli can also be planted.

Dahlia tubers should be planted individually in 3 litre pots of compost under cover and planted out once the chance of frosts has passed. If you have a lot of them, consider placing them tight together in a large tray and covering with damp compost. They will start to sprout in a few weeks and you can take cuttings.

March is also a good month to lift and divide some perennials. Look for large clumps with growth evident from the sides and improve your summer flowering by lifting, dividing and replanting them. I will be giving a talk on division at the garden club soon so come along and take part if you would like to. We would love to see you. Dates will be published in the next edition.

If soil is workable, dig in some compost or manure and add some comfrey pellets or fish, blood and bone. Prune young hedges. If you hedge is one or two years old, cut it back by a third. This may sound a bit harsh but it will promote healthy and vigorous growth and a bushier hedge. This month is a good time to plant a new hedge. Particularly mixed native or hawthorn, both of which are loved by wildlife. Sow courgettes, leeks, beetroot, peas and cucumber under cover and sow broad beans direct outside for good early crops. Early potatoes should also be planted out this month.

I could go on for hours listing all the things that we could be getting on with in
March but I hope that these little titbits help you in some way. Enjoy your gar dens and have fun preparing them for the warm months ahead.
