## Bird Notes June 2019 by Cliff Cooper

93, that's the total number of bird species we saw on our recent mini holiday in Norfolk. I imagine that some of you might think that is a high figure, but in mid- May it should not be too difficult to reach 100+ around the Norfolk coastal area. Even the migratory species we did see appeared to be in smaller numbers.

I am really beginning to believe that we will very soon lose some of our treasured bird species for ever if there is not a more universal attempt to stop their decline. The problems lie not just here where we are putting too much pressure on our land, but in many other parts of the world where our migrants spend the rest of the year; winter feeding grounds in southern Africa are being destroyed for human developments, massive nets (up to 700 km long) are being used to trap birds along the north African coast, while others are shot as they pass over Malta, Cyprus and other countries. What chance do they stand of surviving this onslaught year after year?

Have you heard a cuckoo this year, how many swifts, swallows and house martins have you seen? I have received 1 report of a turtle dove in the village so far and we were fortunate enough to see one fly in and land at Snettisham during our holiday. The marvellous thing about that was that the turtle dove started to sing within five minutes of its arrival from over the North sea!

On a happier note, we did see a party of dotterel taking some time out on farmland near the coast. They will have travelled many, many hundreds of miles to get here and by now will have gone on to Scandinavia for their breeding season from June to August. These lovely little waders have never been common and their numbers are dwindling.

I hope you have not found this article too depressing, but we must do something drastic very soon or it will be too late for many of our feathered friends.

#### LAWSHALL GARDEN CLUB

June....The month of the rose. Those of you that know me will be aware of my passion for roses and June is the month when they smother us with their wonderful colours and scents. I appreciate that we don't all love them with their thorns and the constant need to be deadheading and nurturing but they are quintessentially English and part of our summer.

As we enter the summer months and the weather gets warmer we can think about propagating some of our shrubs. This is the time when we can do so without the need for a greenhouse. All you will need is the top half of a plastic bottle. OK, so plastic bottles have become the enemy of late but they are still here whether we like it nor not so why not put them to good use. Start propagating as soon as this years' new young shoots have reached about 10-15cm long. Snip soft shoot tips off the parent plant and remove the lower leaves. Make a clean cut across the base just below a node (where a leaf joins a stem). The cutting should be 8-10cm long once prepared.

Dip the base in rooting powder and plant them into prepared ground about 15cm apart. They won't all root so plant more than you need. Water them in then cover with the top half of a plastic bottle with the screw cap on. This allows humidity to build up. You can remove then cap after 2 or 3 weeks. Perhaps 4 weeks later you can remove the bottle during the day but replace it at night. This allows for gentle acclimatisation. Give this a try and see how you get on. Members of the garden club can perhaps grow some to swap or sell on through our stalls at summer fairs etc. The best plants for propagating in summer are Cornus, Berberis, Deutzia, Hebe, Forsythia, Hydrangea, Philadelphus, Ribes and Weigela. Obviously Roses are also included in this. I tried propagating some roses last summer and 2 successfully took out of the 6 I tried so I was quite happy with that. I will try again this year but in a pot instead of the ground to see how successful this method is.

Gardening is all about experimenting. Whether it be propagating, the siting of plants, types of plants and different types of vegetables or fruits. It's fun to try and very rewarding when you succeed. Don't forget to keep pots watered during dry spells and plant out lots of colour once all chance of frost has gone. It is the 12<sup>th</sup> May as I write this and a frost is forecast for tomorrow so you need to be careful.

Enjoy your gardens and don't forget to visit other gardens for ideas and inspiration. Invite others into your garden too. Take care; I'll be back next month.




