Bird Notes October 2019 by Cliff Cooper

At the beginning of September we were on holiday in a remote cottage in North Yorkshire. I was standing in the garden of the cottage, just admiring the many swallows and house martins hunting up and down the meadow alongside the river and wishing they were this plentiful back home, when, quite out of nowhere, they were joined spectacularly by a party of about two hundred sand martins. The sand martins flew up the river a little way then turned back towards me and flew over my head flying southwards. They were gone as quickly as they arrived, and I had never seen so many sand martins away from their nest sites; clearly they were on their autumn migration.

As I stood pondering about what had just happened I realised that all had gone quiet and the swallows and house martins were nowhere to be seen. After a few seconds all became clear as a pair of hobbies cruised into view. They must have been following the sand martin party, looking to catch an easy meal. They too disappeared behind me and gradually everything returned to normal on the meadows. Quite an exciting few minutes!

Back home now, and we still have a few house martins hanging on while the weather holds fine. One or two have even had a look at our house, flying up to the roofline and investigating possible nest sites for next year! At least, I believe that is what they are doing, but as yet they have shown no interest whatever in our artificial nests. We will have to wait for next spring to find out what happens.

Local news: two ospreys visited Lackford lakes, one only stayed a few hours, but the other stayed for nearly a week. Of course that was the week we were away on holiday!

LAWSHALL GARDEN CLUB: October

October is the month for lawn care and important preparations for the winter months ahead. If you have a lawn like mine which is large, uneven, very mossy in places and full of thatch, then you will know exactly the hard work that this month brings. I accept that I will never have a pristine lawn purely because of its' current make up but I will put in all the work required to keep it as green and lush as possible. I have invested in a large lawnraker/aerator which will be put to good use. I will fork the worst affected areas too and apply top dressings where I can. A good autumn lawn feed is essential and some areas may well need re-seeding as well. It will all be worth it in the end. September/October are the ideal months for re-seeding or laying turf. Obviously laying turf is quicker than seeding and brings an instant effect but is far cheaper and just as good in the long run. I have certain areas that I will be trying both methods this year. What both have in common is the need to be kept watered. Normally the rain during these months will suffice but who knows what our weather will bring us in these changing times.

Something that can damage lawns and that links in nicely with the winter preparation is leaves. Left lying on the grass will damage the grass so there is a need to sweep it all up. Ideally, you will collect it and make a pile for the creation of leaf mould. A simple container made of chicken wire will hold the leaves while they rot down over the months to make beautiful mulch and feed for your beds. Any leaves lying on borders can be left as they will rot down into the soil and provide cover for the small creatures to shelter under during cold winter days and nights.

Other jobs for this month include planting some bulbs including lilies and tulips although personally, I tend to wait until November to plant my tulips. Dahlias and Gladioli can be lifted and stored in October but again, I have found that with a good few inches of mulch, my Dahlias will survive the winter without being lifted. Bare areas of soil need to be dug over and perhaps a good layer of compost laid on top to been drawn in by the worms over the winter. Homemade compost is the best if you have it.

The last apples and pears should be picked this month along with your potatoes and carrots before any sharp frosts damage them. The fruit can be stored wrapped in newspaper in a cool dark place making sure they do not touch each other. That way they will last a good number of weeks if not months. Potatoes are best stored in hessian sacks. Consider lifting and dividing your rhubarb this month too for fresher, stronger growth in the spring.

Finally, enjoy the colours of autumn in your garden and locally in Golden Wood and Frithy Wood. They are at their glorious best this time of year. The next Garden club meeting will be on the **20th November** at Lawshall Village Hall. I do hope that many of you will come along and give us a try. We will have a guest speaker and plenty of gardening advice on offer as well as tea, coffee and biscuits.

From 'The Archives' ~ OCTOBER 2019 THE LAST PUBLIC EXECUTION IN BURY ST EDMUNDS

This is where we left the story last month There was sufficient evidence for George to be brought before the Magistrates and charged with murder and he was reprimanded to appear at the next Suffolk Assizes in April at Bury St Edmunds.....

George was defended by a Mr Power, who based the defence on the fact that his client suffered from fits. He claimed that the two lovers, desperately unhappy, because they were unable to marry, had made a suicide-pact but that George had been overcome by epilepsy whilst in the water and had fallen on top of Elizabeth, drowning her. The convicting evidence given by a Mr King, surgeon of Hartest, stated that he had examined the body and found a mark of a blow on the right eye, the mouth closed with froth oozing from nose and teeth. The fingernails were full of sand and mud with bruising under the elbow of each arm indicating that she had been held down. Certainly, this would indicate that if there had been a suicide-pact it was a one-sided affair since Elizabeth had been dragged from the thorn bushes obviously unwillingly and forcibly drowned in the pond. Perhaps it was George's drink befuddled mind which concocted such a story believing it to be true, but if it was initially agreed by Elizabeth, she obviously changed her mind when she saw that he intended to carry out the deed, whilst George's attempt to drown himself came to nought as he was saved by a "fit".

The Judge in summing up, made a scathing attack on the prisoner's defence since no medical evidence was available, or produced, to clarify the validity of George's "fits" or whether or not the same were epileptic. In his view it was an insult to expect the jury to swallow such a story which was baseless.

After a few minutes' deliberation, the jury without leaving the box returned a verdict of Guilty. The Lord Chief Justice placing the black cap on his head sentenced George to be hanged on Tuesday 21 April 1851.

On the day, an estimated crowd of 5,000 came to see a fearful George hung. Public hangings were regarded as entertainment for the people in the same way as fairs were. Hawkers would sell their wares; pickpockets would be loitering around, and bets would be placed upon the length of time the prisoner could survive the ordeal before he met his Maker. It was a day out for the whole family with little sympathy shown for the condemned prisoner. It was after all a sporting occasion. However, there were moves afoot to abolish this macabre practice and for executions to be held within the confines of the prison away from public gaze. Two chief instigators of this change in Victorian views were Charles Dickens and William Makepeace Thackeray and in 1868 pressure was brought to bear on the government and public hangings ceased.
