Lawshall Parish Council had very little notice of the cancellation of our Suffolk Norse 375 bus service. The service is due to finish on 2nd November despite there being no public consultation.

Parish councils from the 5 parishes affected : Alpheton, Hawstead, Lawshall, Nowton and Shimpling have met to discuss the issues. They have formed a group called "Community 375", led by the chair of Hawstead parish council. Suffolk County Council and our County and District councillors have been involved. **There is a petition available to sign in the Swan pub**. The hope is to get Suffolk Norse to defer or delay the cessation of the service so that proper consultations can be undertaken.

Bird Notes November 2019 by Cliff Cooper

The weather certainly wasn't being at its kindest for our latest visit to the Norfolk coast; in fact it was wet and very windy most of the time, which severely affected the birding opportunities. The one good point about this, however, was the very high tides caused by these weather conditions.

On one very blowy morning we stood on the shingle beach at Cley trying to hold the telescope still while we watched for birds passing by close inshore while the sea was only a few metres away. There was quite a bit of bird movement; and we saw lots of dunlin, ringed plovers, and Brent geese flying close by. There was also a gannet diving for fish a little further out to sea, but the most spectacular bird we saw was a red necked diver flying just above the waves only about forty metres away from us. A fine reward for our bravery in battling the elements!

Going away from the shoreline for a bit of respite from the wind and rain, we went for a wander in the Pinewoods at Wells next- the- sea. There we saw a couple of chiffchaffs, a female blackcap, and a late swallow flew over the dunes in an attempt to find a little food before crossing the north sea on its long migration.

On the journey back home we stopped off at Lynford arboretum. It was a fairly quiet and unexciting walk around the arboretum area, but on the way back to the car we heard redwing flying overhead. I stopped to watch as at least a couple of hundred redwings drifted past in the space of about five minutes. I am more used to hearing these birds at night as they make longer journeys in the hours of darkness, making their squeaky calls as they keep in contact with each other.

Back home, nothing much to report apart from a tawny owl seen regularly in golden wood, where we will shortly be putting up a pair of owl boxes kindly donated to the management committee.

LAWSHALL GARDEN CLUB

November can be a cold and damp month with few flowers left in the garden but we still have berries, evergreen foliage and the glorious reds and yellows of the leaves to cheers us up.

November is the clean-up and prepare month. Old or used pots need cleaning or discarding if you don't intend to re-use them. Tools need a good clean as well. This is a very important job as dirty tools can harbour diseases over winter. Lawnmowers need servicing and heaters installed in greenhouses. Perhaps your greenhouse will need further insulation too. If you have any pots that will remain out over winter, consider insulating those too unless you are sure that they are frost proof.

In the garden you can continue with your winter digging over and consider planting bare root trees, shrubs and roses. Fruit trees and bushes can also be planted now. Rhubarb crowns can be lifted and divided now. And this month is your last chance to lift and store dahlia corms if you feel you need to. I tend to leave mine in with a good 3 to 4 inches of mulch over them. Keep collecting the falling leaves from your lawns and store them to make a good leaf mould and when the frosts arrive, keep off the grass as much as you can.

I will be spending time making sure that all my tools are spotlessly clean ready for next spring and I will be rifling through seed catalogues ready for propagating in my new greenhouse. I have finally treated myself and I look forward to experimenting and learning all about greenhouse gardening. I also have around 200 tulip bulbs to plant which will be done this month. November is a good month to plant out tulip bulbs and a little tip I can give you is to sprinkle a little grit at the base of the planting hole for each bulb. They will thank you for this by producing strong and colourful displays next year.

The garden club will be meeting again at **7.30pm on November 20th at Lawshall Village Hall** with a talk by Rodney Tibbs on creating a cottage garden. I am working on a new and exciting list of garden speakers for 2020 including a well known gardening celebrity so please watch out for details via this magazine. I also hope to arrange a trip out and a garden party for next year. If you want to join our club, come along to one of our meetings and have a chat. Your first visit is generally free.

A Forest for Our Children

This month's volunteer morning will be:

Sunday 24th November, 9:30-12:30, Golden Wood, Bury Road

The woods are looking particularly beautiful at the moment, living up to their Golden name! We know people sometimes get confused about the difference between Forest for Our Children (FOC) – Lawshall's Community Woodlands – and Greenlight Trust, which is a separate charity housed in the Foundry on Bury Road. So I thought I'd have another go at setting our the difference!

It's confusing! Forest for Our Childrem is the volunteer group of villagers who look after Lawshall's Community Woodlands. We meet once a month on a Sunday morning. We cut back growth to keep the paths clear. We rake the grass when it's been mown. We tackle the black thorn and coppice the willow. Every so often we cut and bend trees to make a hedge.

It's hard work to keep up with Golden Wood, because of course it keeps growing back! It takes hundreds of volunteer hours every year and its essential to keep the woodland safe for everyone in the community to use.

The **Greenlight Trust** is a separate environmental and educational charity. They're based at The Foundry on Bury Road. Sometimes their groups help out with specific tasks in Golden Wood and they also use it as an outdoor educational space. They do amazing work and show how transformational green learning can be.

There are two entrances to Golden Wood – one on Kelso Place, which leads directly into the wood, and one behind The Foundry on Bury Road. Please do feel that you can use either entrance any time you like. Golden Wood is a Community Woodland, it's there for everyone. It was planted to be Lawshall's shared green place. For 25 years, every child at All Saints School has grown a tree and planted it in the wood. Just last week, reception class collected their first acorns, keeping the cycle going.

If you love walking in the woods, please support us if you can. We're always grateful for just one more volunteer, even if you can only come to one Sunday a year. Or join our Friends programme and make a small contribution.

Green Light for a Brighter Future



Green Light Trust, a charity with its head office located in Lawshall, celebrates its 30th anniversary this year. The trust began as an environmental project, following its founders' trip to Papua New Guinea, where local residents, Ric Edelman and Nigel Hughes, helped the indigenous tribes there protect a huge part of their rainforest home from de-forestation. When challenged about what they were doing back in the UK, the idea for Green Light Trust was born.

Thirty years on, and many environmental projects later, including helping local communities across Suffolk and Norfolk set up 62 community woodlands for local people to manage and enjoy (including Golden Wood behind their Foundry HQ) the trust uses the power of nature to help over 1500 disadvantaged and marginalised adults and children each year. Delivering its woodland wellbeing and educational support programmes in nearby Frithy Wood, a SSSI (Site of Special Scientific Interest) which is owned and managed by the trust, at Castan Wood in Martlesham Heath, and at RSPB Minsmere, as well as at other green sites across East Anglia, the trust has helped thousands of people facing personal challenges that are preventing the effects of trauma or abuse, or in recovery from substance misuse, long-term unemployed and probation service users, as well as children and young adults who have behavioural issues or learning disabilities. It also works with schools, connecting local children with nature, and teaches Forest Schooling.

Today, the trust has refined its approach in such a way that it brings exceptional results as a tool in employee engagement and corporate communication activity, while at the same time providing a great opportunity for businesses to support a meaningful charity which enriches the lives of local people.



From the Archives November 2019 - MEMORY OF AN AIRMAN

Looking out over the front field from my house window, it is difficult to believe that it has ever been anything other than a peaceful area, and yet in March 1945 it was the place where a young Dutch airman, Johannes Bartholomeus Jat Van Mesdag, violently lost his life.

The second of four sons born to J.S and M.A.C van Mesdag in Holland on 3rd October 1923, his father's birthday, Johannes (nicknamed Jat) is best remembered by his relatives as a young man who was blessed with a great zest for living, was enormous fun and was also a natural sportsman. Hockey was his favourite game and he took a leading part in the repeated destruction of the lawn at his parent's home by organizing on it frequent hockey matches. It seems that his parents were very tolerant of this wilful mischief, and the regular broken windows that resulted from boisterous sporting enthusiasm, as they believed that sport was especially good for the young. Perhaps it was Jat's spontaneous natural charm, following each destructive game, that did much to bolster this tolerance.

In January 1940 Jat left his hometown of Hilversum (barely missing the invasion of the Germans in May of that year) and came to England where he attended Haileybury College at Hertford Heath. Some six months later following a suggestion from his tutor he enrolled at St Andrews School in Middletown, Delaware USA to finish his secondary schooling and from there he moved on to Williams College in Virginia USA. By mid-June 1942, at the age of 18, he decided that the time had come to join the war effort as a pilot and he attempted to enlist into the air force in Canada, but was unsuccessful, due to failing an eye test.

But he was determined to become a fighter pilot and with single minded deliberation he set about finding how this might be accomplished. The first obstacle to overcome was the eye test and then a circuitous route to pilot status was his aim. To this end in July 1942 he became a regular conscript in the Dutch forces in Canada and a month later was transferred to the 10th detachment and twelve days after that he was moved to England. On the 22nd August he joined the Dutch forces' Princes Irene Brigade and two months later (having passed the hurdle of the eye test) he became a reservist volunteer destined for pilot training and detached to the Royal Air Force. Some thirteen months later he obtained his pilot's licence and was made Sergeantpilot.

From September to November 1944 he flew 49 sorties in Spitfires. He then joined the famous 64 squadron to train in the much more powerful Mustang P-51 fighters from Bradwell Bay and subsequently provided escort flights for allied bombers on their missions to Germany. He completed his 13th sortie at the end of December. There were eight other Dutchmen flying in the unit, although Jat was the youngest by quite a few years. On the 4th January 1945 his squadron was stationed at Bentwaters, Suffolk and in February 1945 he became Pilot-Officer. The 6th March, his mother's birthday, was a day of rain and dense cloud and all American operations had been cancelled. In spite of the continuing very poor weather conditions in Holland and West Germany English bombers were attacking Wesel, Salzbergan and Munster at night, and required escorts. No mention is made in the records as to whether the crash took place on his way to liaise with the bombers to be escorted or whether it was following his return from the night flight sortie that he crashed into the field at Lawshall and was killed at the age of 21 years. Nor do the records indicate as to why the accident took place, whether it was pilot error or mechanical failure. Johannes Bartholomeus Jat Van Mesdag is buried at Cambridge City cemetery.
