PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Planning Applications received:

App.No. DC19/05904: Wood View, Bury Road: erection of single storey extension. Application supported, no objections.

App. No. DC/19.05618: Green Farm Barn, Lawshall Green: erection of 1 dwelling and cart lodge (following extension of existing barn): The Councillors do not object in principle but made these comments: application is incomplete as it does not comply with the NHPlan as a CS11 checklist or LVA were not included. Also the design is too modern; a more sympathetic design incorporating the original wooden features of the barn would be more in keeping with the surrounding area.

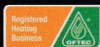

Bird Notes by Cliff Cooper February 2020

It has been a wet but relatively mild winter (so far!). The milder weather on the continent means that we get fewer fieldfares and redwings over here; I have certainly not seen any really large flocks this year, other than one long movement of redwings back in October. Another bird missing this year is the waxwing- we had lots of them quite locally over the winter of 2018/19, but I have not heard of any at all this time. Fluctuations in numbers of winter migrants such as these are not necessarily anything to worry about as these birds react to weather conditions and will not bother to move great distances if it is not essential for them to do so in order to find food supplies.

The upside of the less cold weather is that potentially more of our resident smaller birds will survive the winter, hence there will be more of them around when the breeding season starts. We will be doing a common bird survey in Golden wood this spring so we should see if this is the case.

On the subject of Golden wood, the Steering group (the people who look after the management of the wood on our behalf) have relaxed the requirement for dogs to be kept on leads in the newer part of the wood. The dogs now only need to be kept on a lead through the ground nesting bird season which is 1st March to 30th June. Please abide by this request when visiting the wood in spring as birds like the willow warbler are easily disturbed at their nest.

Following my little mention of buzzards in the field at Hawstead, the record currently stands at 6 individuals in that field at the same time- unless of course you can beat the record!

LAWSHALL GARDEN CLUB February 2020

February is the month that promises so much with spring on the horizon. There is a lot to be getting on with this month, so let's see what we should be doing.

We can start by preparing seed beds for planting by warming the soil using fleece, cloches or plastic sheeting, but leave well alone if the ground is still frozen. Dig out obvious perennial weeds before they set seed and start to spread. Organise your seeds into date order ready for sowing. It will make life so much easier.

Shrubs such as cornus and salix cultivars (coloured stems for winter interest) can be pruned back now to the very base of the stems. I tend to cut back about half of the stems to allow for varied growth through the year. Wisteria can also be pruned now taking side shoots back to 2 or 3 buds from the main stem. Old stems from ornamental grasses should also be cut back this month before they get too mixed up with the new growth. Overwintered Fuchsias can be cut back to 1 or 2 buds on each stem.

Lift and divide snowdrops while still in the green this month, ensuring you replant them straight away and look out for Hellebore leaf spot, removing affected leaves. Don't worry if all leaves have to be removed as the plant will withstand this.

February is a good month to begin chitting your early potatoes by placing them on end in an egg box and putting them in a bright, cool, frost free place. In the fruit garden, blackcurrants, redcurrants and gooseberries can be pruned back to form an open goblet shape. Remove some of the oldest stems. Consider covering strawberries with a cloche to encourage an early crop and force your rhubarb, again for an early crop if required.

Deciduous hedges should be trimmed now before birds begin nesting and give your bird feeders a good clean before re-filling. Any empty pots that have been sitting outside should be cleaned with warm water and mild detergent before using them to prevent disease and give your tools a final once over to check they are clean and healthy for use across the garden.

Finally, once all this is done, go inside and draw out a plan for your beds, particularly the veg beds. Order your seeds, summer bulbs, onion sets and asparagus crowns ready for spring planting. This all seems like a lot to do but it really isn't and it will save you so much work later as spring takes hold. Sit back now and watch the early bulbs gradually introduce colour and light into your garden and, as always, enjoy the garden.

Notes about the Archives - February 2020

At the beginning of a new year and a new decade it seems an opportune moment to say a few words about the Lawshall Archives and the Local History Recorders.

I have been the Recorder for Lawshall for over thirty years; my interest in collecting information about the village I was born in long ago began when I wrote my thesis about my farming family and the village back in 1969. Ever since I have collected everything and anything to do with the village. What excites me most is when someone shares a photo that I have never seen before, hence the constant request on this page for any photos.

As many of you know we have been cataloguing documents for several years and hopefully some of these will be available at the Suffolk Record Office in Bury or Ipswich from May this year. Sadly, my time is very limited now as more and more of my time is taken with caring for husband Grenville who has MND. For any of you who are not familiar with this disease, it is one of the most insidious, cruel diseases there can be, it's supposed to be rare, but more and more are being diagnosed and sadly there is no cure.

I have had support from a wonderful team who have helped with the cataloguing over the years, but I have very little time for this now. However, a newcomer to the village, Leanne, has helped edit documents for publication which you will have read the last three months. I am very grateful for this help. I know she is currently working on Coldham Hall history. I know that there is a perception that 'nobody' reads this magazine, but I know this is not true, so I hope that any newcomers to the village will appreciate what we share through this site. Last year I was able to share many documents and photos with the school, which I hope gave the children an appreciation of how much the place has changed over the years. My main embarrassment is the 'dormant' website, maybe one day, I or someone, will have time to bring it to life

again. I also worry that I can't always respond in full to the request for information that come to me and, I am aware that I have promised photos to some people in the village. (you know who you are!) Maybe this year!



The Archives Group was set up to enable me to share all the documents I have collected since becoming the Local History Recorder. Most of the villages in Suffolk have a Recorder and it's our role to collect absolutely everything to do with the village we live in. I should be recording changes and news every day. Everything is history the moment it has happened! But we can only do what we can with what time we have.



Please let me know if you have photos or documents for the Archives. And remember that history is anything that happened before this present moment!

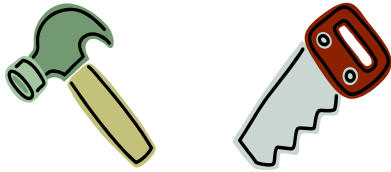
