



Hello!

We live in Lawshall and are setting up a "CORONAVIRUS LAWSHALL HELP GROUP". to ensure that no one is left totally alone during the Government's order for self-isolation. In short, we do not want you feeling isolated and alone.

We are here for you and want to help. This Group will NEVER ask you for:

- Money. We will only ask you for money once we have purchased any items you have asked for AND have a
 receipt for your shopping. If we do not have a receipt then you do not have to pass money over.
- 2. Bank account details.
- 3. Personal Information. unless you volunteer it.
- 4. Passwords.

We would like to be there for you during your isolation. We can:

- 1. Ring you, just to have a chat and find out how you are, what you have been doing and if you need anything,
- Help with any pets if you do feel unwell, or if they do during your isolation by taking them to the vets of your choice.
- 3. Go to the shops for you and pick up anything you need, (so long as it is available in the shops!)
- 4. Post letters for you or pick up mail for you from the sorting office, if necessary.
- Contact your loved ones if you feel unable to or be there for them, if they live away from the area and cannot get in to see and be with you.
- Help you ensure you have supplies of your correct medication. We could either pick it up for you, or ensure that the pharmacy knows that you would like it delivered.
- 7. Pass your details on to a village resident, who lives near to you and would really like to stand by you.
- 8. Help a friend in Lawshall whom you think may be self isolating, if you give us their details.

Bird Notes by Cliff Cooper April 2020

With the progressing spread of Covid19 you might well be forced to selfisolate for a week or so. With a little preparation, you could make more of this unexpected time at home; what you need to buy is not toilet roll but bird food.

A supply of fat balls, mealworms , niger seeds and sunflower hearts will prepare your garden as a very attractive place for the birds. While you have all this spare time on your hands you can sit by the window and count all the (new) birds that come to your garden; its amazing how addictive this can become as you notice birds on your little patch for the first time.

You will need to be a little patient (pun!) as it will take the birds a day or two to discover the lovely new supply of food you have put out for them, but you will be rewarded eventually. Just watching my small garden for ten minutes this morning gave me a look at fourteen species- they are not all there at the same time, the picture is constantly changing, and it is also important to provide fresh drinking water for them.

I would be very interested to hear of any exciting or unusual sightings you get.

I am writing these notes on 16th March and as yet I have not heard my first chiffchaff of the spring, although a friend heard one very close to Lawshall on the tenth- my year on year average is around the fourteenth so not too concerned yet.

A little owl showed itself in the hedge near Hawstead at the weekend, first time I have seen one in that vicinity for quite a while.



Hopefully, I will be allowed out to see the spring arrivals as they appear for the summer.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION FROM THE LONG MELFORD PRACTICE FOR OUR LOCAL POPULATION DURING THE COVID-19 VIRUS CRISIS

If you currently have a **booked appointment** at the surgery, keep it as arranged. We will contact you if we need to cancel or re-arrange it. **BUT** if you develop a new continuous cough and/or fever, telephone the surgery to cancel it and self-isolate for 7 days.

We will be operating a telephone triage system for all new requests for patient appointments as from Monday 16th March 2020. If you need <u>medical or nursing</u> <u>advice</u> and DO **NOT** HAVE A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH AND/OR FEVER, telephone the surgery (01787 378 223) and the receptionist will book for you a telephone triage call on that day from a doctor or nurse who will decide with you an appropriate plan for your care. Please be aware that we are likely only to be able to deal with urgent matters.

Routine Clinics (eg diabetes, COPD, asthma): We will not be asking patients to come to the surgery for your surgery for routine checks but you might be telephoned by a Nurse who will complete the check via a telephone consultation.

<u>Cervical smear tests</u> Continue to contact the surgery to make appointments in the usual way. A nurse will call you back to confirm whether or not you need an appointment. BUT if you have an appointment and develop a new continuous cough and/or fever, telephone the surgery to cancel it and self-isolate for 7 days.

<u>Childhood immunisations</u>: Parents will continue to receive appointments for their child in the usual way – attend the appointment BUT if you or your child develops a new continuous cough and/or fever, telephone the surgery to cancel it and self-isolate for 7 days.

We are sorry that it is anticipated that we will be able to staff only one surgery; The Lavenham Surgery will be closed for a while and if you are invited to a physical consultation with a nurse or GP it will be at Long Melford.

This protocol is based on the latest Government advice as of 13th March. If you come to the surgery, please try to attend on your own and certainly do not bring anyone who has a new continuous cough and/or fever.

LAWSHALL GARDEN CLUB: Amazing April

It's been a wet autumn and winter and so far spring hasn't exactly been dry so our gardens have had a good soaking. Nevertheless, April showers are still welcome just so long as they stay as showers. The gardens are now growing rapidly and need all the goodness they can get to be strong and healthy. If you haven't done it yet, your roses will need a feed and look out for early signs of greenfly and black aphids. Wash them off with a jet of water or simply wipe them off with your fingers. Another group that needs a feed in April is fruit. Particularly blackcurrants, blackberries and other similar hybrid berries. These plants grow extremely rapidly during this month and should be topped up with a good high-nitrogen feed. Be careful not to over feed them though as this may lead to fruit being too soft and liable to attack from pests. Simply follow the advice on the packets.

Cane fruit should be checked regularly and the areas around the base weeded weekly if possible. We can still get night frosts in April so don't be too quick to remove any frost protection you have in place.

April is the last opportunity to lift and divide summer flowering perennials so best get that done ASAP. New perennials can be planted this month and basal cuttings taken now will grow well. Dahlia tubers can go in the ground now too. Dahlias are greedy plants so add plenty of organic matter and a good dressing of fertiliser when planting. The crown of the tuber should be about 3inches deep. Place a cane or other support in place straight away and support your plants as they start to grow.

Many of you will notice little clumps of self-sown foxgloves scattered here and there. If you want to keep them, they are easy to relocate. If the ground is dry, water the area first then lift them with a trowel, making sure you keep some soil around the roots. You can then reposition them wherever it suits you. Water them in gently.

The last of your daffodils need to be deadheaded now but still leave the green to die down naturally to get plenty of flowers next year. This is also your last chance to plant out your maincrop potatoes, so get this done before the end of the month.

Finally, you should be mowing your lawns more regularly now but don't cut them too short. Apply spring feeds according to the instructions on the packets as too much in one area can scorch your grass and even kill it off in patches.

Hopefully, it will be warm enough now to sit out and enjoy the fruits of your labours. Wash down those garden chairs, open a bottle of wine or soft drink and just sit back and watch your garden grow. These are private gardens that only open a couple of times a year and raise money for charities. There are some fantastic gardens very close by that you will probably never have seen. I'm also thinking to support the pub if you do pop in for emergency supplies then buy a drink !



Garage and Shed Security

My name is Phil Kemp and I am a Design Out Crime Officer Suffolk Police for the South and West of Suffolk.

You will probably be aware that we have had a spate of Outbuilding/ Shed burglaries within Suffolk, which are causing distress to residents and commercial businesses.

Basic Crime Reduction Advice from Suffolk Police

Always keep sheds locked, with a good quality close shackle padlock; ensure sheds are behind a secure perimeter; use dusk to dawn lighting; use hasp and staples, a padbar, or coach bolts or non-tamper screws to fasten hinges/hasps; security mark property, with your house number and post code and register your belongings at immobilise.com; fit anchor points to secure items; have a monitored alarm fitted (i.e. texting alarm), and avoid storing high value items.

Register serial numbers of tools and equipment via Immobilise <u>https://www.immobilise.com/</u> and make a personal record. This will help identify items if they are found, and speed up the process of returning items to the owners.

This month was exceptional in many ways. On the 9th we had Storm Ciara bringing rain and very high winds but above average temperature for this time of year. On the 16th we had Storm Dennis again bringing high winds and rain. We had snow on the 27th that only settled for the one day, but it was followed on the 28th by Storm Jorge which brought heavy rain, more winds and above average temperatures. These three officially recognised storms set the tone for a record breaking wet and windy month, where the temperatures meant very little because the winds made things feel much colder than the air temperature was reading. As a whole, the UK suffered very severe flooding.
