

Hello!

We live in Lawshall and are setting up a "CORONAVIRUS LAWSHALL HELP GROUP". to ensure that no one is left totally alone during the Government's order for self-isolation. In short, we do not want you feeling isolated and alone.

We are here for you and want to help. This Group will NEVER ask you for:

- Money. We will only ask you for money once we have purchased any items you have asked for AND have a
 receipt for your shopping. If we do not have a receipt then you do not have to pass money over.
- 2. Bank account details.
- 3. Personal Information. unless you volunteer it.
- 4. Passwords

We would like to be there for you during your isolation. We can:

- 1. Ring you, just to have a chat and find out how you are, what you have been doing and if you need anything,
- Help with any pets if you do feel unwell, or if they do during your isolation by taking them to the vets of your choice.
- 3. Go to the shops for you and pick up anything you need, (so long as it is available in the shops!)
- 4. Post letters for you or pick up mail for you from the sorting office, if necessary.
- Contact your loved ones if you feel unable to or be there for them, if they live away from the area and cannot get in to see and be with you.
- Help you ensure you have supplies of your correct medication. We could either pick it up for you, or ensure that the pharmacy knows that you would like it delivered.
- 7. Pass your details on to a village resident, who lives near to you and would really like to stand by you.
- 8. Help a friend in Lawshall whom you think may be self isolating, if you give us their details.

Bird Notes by Cliff Cooper June 2020

As the spring turns towards summer all our summer birds are now here. My local house martins arrived early (see last month's notes) but have as yet shown no interest whatever in our artificial nests. Unfortunately, there are very few house martins around the Glebe area- I can only ever see about six, and I worry about how long this small group can be sustained.

The situation also seems to be no better for our swifts. The regular party flying around the Glebe started off in early May as just four birds, but now that is down to three! On one single evening I did see seven swifts together overhead, so I assume our birds were joined briefly by a small party from further afield.

On a slightly happier note, one turtle dove and one cuckoo have been reported from the Lawshall Green end of the village. I haven't seen or heard either but thank you to those who let me know of their presence.

Golden wood and the hedgerows around our local fields all seem full of birds this year. There appears to be a blackcap in almost every tree, and similarly the whitethroats and lesser whitethroats are vying for position in the bushes. Greenfinches, goldfinches, and chaffinches all singing together with the occasional yellowhammer makes for a very pleasurable walk.

As the skies blackened and threatened some much needed rain late one recent afternoon, I was scurrying home when I heard what for this part of

the village is an unusual songthat of the mistle thrush. I can't explain why they don't seem to favour this area, maybe they are here and I simply don't notice them? His close cousins, the song thrush and blackbird are always around making their presence heard in the dawn chorus.

Grenville has also been involved with the Suffolk Wildlife Trust for 22 years. Grenville played pivotal roles in several key developments such as the establishment of Lackford Lakes. Volunteering as a vital member of a small group, he helped establish one of the most important nature reserves in the county. Grenville was involved at a critical stage in SWT's development, chairing a working group in building the current visitor and education centre. As a trustee from 1997 to 2005, he initiated a review of the Trust's govern-

ance, enabling the trust to become the strong organisation it is today.

All who come into contact with Grenville still talk about him years later, and speak warmly of his calm, generous support; delivered in an entirely selfless and understated manner. Grenville has personally motivated 1000s of people during his lifetime of contribution to this region.



On April 30th, Lord Lieutenant of Suffolk Lady Clare Euston presented the medal to Mr Clarke, who is in the advanced stages of motor neurone disease, on Lesley Dolphin's BBC Radio Suffolk show.

She described the medal as Suffolk's "greatest accolade to one of its own" and said the honour is "an opportunity to single out people who have done

something extraordinary for this county".

Lady Clare said: "Grenville, it gives me great pleasure – and you'll have to imagine that I am with you – to present you with the Suffolk medal which comes with enormous gratitude from all those of us who live in Suffolk and love this county."

"We owe you an enormous debt of gratitude."

The medal itself had been delivered to Mr Clarke's house prior to the ceremony so that his wife Elizabeth was able to present him with it during the investiture broadcast.

Presenter Lesley Dolphin asked how the couple were feeling and Mrs Clarke simply said: "We're very emotional, I'll say no more."

She then proceeded to read the words Mr Clarke had prepared for the ceremony, which read:

"I was totally surprised when I learnt I had been granted this award. I have to thank those who, over the past 50 years, have given me the opportunity to have such a rewarding and enjoyable time with so many lovely people."

"This award is not just for me, but for all those who have preceded me and followed through with projects like the Community Woodlands with Greenlight Trust and Lackford reserve with the Suffolk Wildlife Trust."

We will be operating a telephone triage system for all new requests for patient appointments as from Monday 16th March 2020. If you need <u>medical or nursing</u> <u>advice</u> and DO **NOT** HAVE A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH AND/OR FEVER, telephone the surgery (01787 378 223) and the receptionist will book for you a telephone triage call on that day from a doctor or nurse who will decide with you an appropriate plan for your care. Please be aware that we are likely only to be able to deal with urgent matters.

Routine Clinics (eg diabetes, COPD, asthma): We will not be asking patients to come to the surgery for your surgery for routine checks but you might be telephoned by a Nurse who will complete the check via a telephone consultation.

<u>Cervical smear tests</u> Continue to contact the surgery to make appointments in the usual way. A nurse will call you back to confirm whether or not you need an appointment. BUT if you have an appointment and develop a new continuous cough and/or fever, telephone the surgery to cancel it and self-isolate for 7 days.

<u>Childhood immunisations:</u> Parents will continue to receive appointments for their child in the usual way – attend the appointment BUT if you or your child develops a new continuous cough and/or fever, telephone the surgery to cancel it and self-isolate for 7 days.

We are sorry that it is anticipated that we will be able to staff only one surgery; The Lavenham Surgery will be closed for a while and if you are invited to a physical consultation with a nurse or GP it will be at Long Melford.

This protocol is based on the latest Government advice as of 13th March. If you come to the surgery, please try to attend on your own and certainly do not bring anyone who has a new continuous cough and/or fever.

CORONAVIRUS AND THE RESIDENTS OF LAWSHALL.

I have been asked to write something to clear up some of the legal myths of do's and don'ts during this lockdown for those who live in Lawshall. Unfortunately, because of the space available in the magazine, I shall have to address things as briefly as possible I start from the premise that I am not a politician, a member of the NHS or any other practical group. I have been a WPC, and am currently practicing law — albeit remotely at the moment. My angle in this article will be personal, and one that is set out to help, but cannot be taken as tramlines in which to walk.

The Coronavirus Bill 2020 was rushed through Parliament It was enacted on 25th March 2020, becoming law. However, the measures were already being applied on 23rd March 2020. This Act ordered a lockdown of all the residents of England. Thus, ensuring that this pandemic, Coronavirus or Covid19, did not claim more lives and put further strain on the NHS than humanly possible. Effectively, by reducing the contact of individuals with others, thus the reduction in the spread of the virus is being achieved.

Questions I have been asked:

Q: Can I go out and exercise? How many times in a day can I exercise? Is it true that I can only exercise for an hour?

A: The law does not prevent us exercising for as long as we want and as many times as we want. There was a myth, a few weeks ago that it should be for "an hour". This arose from a misquoting of Michael Gove who actually said "I would have thought for most people a walk of up to an hour, a run of 30 minutes or a cycle ride of between that, depending on their level of fitness, is appropriate."

Q: Can I use my car during the lockdown?

A: It depends! NO you cannot drive your car if you do not have a specific destination in mind. Driving from, say, home to Chapel and Wakes Colne merely to turn Around and go home again, without having done something specific at Chapel and Wakes Colne is not allowed.

THE EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE is Domestic Violence. If you have no idea where you are going but need to get out of the house to keep safe then you MUST leave the house immediately. The fact you have no idea of your destination is not an issue you must keep safe.

YES if you have a specific and reasonable excuse for taking the car out – such as, but not limited to, driving to a shop, seeking medical attention, going to work, going to a place (ideally nearby) to exercise or as a carer. BUT—please bear in mind that driving should be kept to a minimum for a number of reasons, not least of which is if you are involved in a serious accident then you could, potentially, be putting others lives at risk and you will be taking up the time and resources of NHS staff which could usefully be applied elsewhere.

Q: My MOT is due up now, what should I do?

A: Your vehicle's MOT expiry date will be extended by 6 months if it's due on or after 30 March 2020 - but you must keep your vehicle safe to drive.

Q: I have a child who is under 18. I am no longer together with their father. My child lives with me but wants to see their father.

A: The law is clear on this point. Children under 18 must maintain contact with both parents. They can be taken between the homes by the most direct route possible. (This point is, of course, dependent on the safety of each parent with the other, or members of their households.).

Q: My dog has just injured himself and is bleeding everywhere.

The cat is unwell. Can I go to the Vet?

A: Of course you can. The Vets are Coronavirus compliant, so you will have to be guided by them when you get to the surgery.

Q: 1) I am the victim of domestic abuse. I am so scared, what can I do? 2) If I do go to someone else's home, as a place of safety, will I be in trouble, or get them into trouble?

- A: 1) You must make sure, first and foremost, that you are safe. You are allowed to leave the place of abuse to go to a place of safety. Also, if you can, talk to someone about what you are going through. You are not alone.
- 2) If you are a victim of domestic abuse and you want to go to another person's home then they should not get into trouble if you turn up on their doorstep.

Q The Church should be the focal point of village life – why aren't they ringing the bells on a Thursday at 8pm or allowing us into the Church?

A: Quite simply the law says they cannot. Even our Rector, Jeremy Parsons, is not allowed into the Church at the moment. At the moment (27/4/2020), the only reason for the Church to open its doors is for "an important reason" such as a funeral – and that can be graveside only. The Church remains interested and wanting to help all the residents of Lawshall and Jeremy has asked me to say he can be contacted on 01284 846166 or via email on rector@stedmundway.uk. He is holding daily services by telephone.

Q: 1) My neighbours are having people over. I know that they are maintaining the 2 metres apart rule, but I thought they weren't allowed to do this during the lockdown.

2) If I see the neighbours having people over, what should I do?

- A: 1) This type of socialising, even if you are family living in different properties is not allowed during the lockdown. It is against the law. You cannot go to a property you are not resident in for social reasons. You can go to deliver medicine, food etc or as a carer or to fulfil an essential role but otherwise you cannot go. The police can, and will if they find out about it, give advice or sanction those whom they believe are disobeying the law.
- 2) This has to be your personal decision, there are no laws, yet, as to what we must do. Really, there are three options open to you:
- 1. Report them to the police, but remember you will probably be living next to them for many years after this is all over
- 2. Ring them up and ask if it is a good time for a chat, and then discuss what you have seen and your concerns.
- 3. Do nothing.

Q: Often when I am out shopping or exercising, others don't keep their distance from me what should I do?

A: The law says that you must maintain your social distance. That is 2 metres apart. Apart means, from the front, back and sides (I cannot imagine a situation where it is above or below, but they apply too!!). If someone is so close to you that you can touch them (don't!) but move yourself away. There is no obligation on us to keep others safe. The obligation is on us to keep ourselves safe. IF the same person is failing to maintain social distancing you could ask them, politely, to keep their distance. It is a matter for you and your judgement at the time.

Q: If I go to the Village Hall on a Wednesday between 10.30hrs and 12.00hrs in Law-shall to pick up some fruit and vegetables, am I breaking the law if I am there as there are more than two people there?

A: No you are not breaking the law, buying fruit and vegetables, even from a "pop up" stall is considered to be shopping. What you MUST do is to maintain the Social Distancing rule of 2 metres apart.

Q: I have to go to work and am scared because they are not maintaining the social distancing rules. What can I do? What should my employer be doing to keep me safe?

A: In brief, the law says that employers should seek, where possible, to ensure that their employees maintain the 2 metre Social Distancing . If you are really concerned then consider raising it with your employer. The employer should also be providing hand sanitiser and access to soap and water to enable to you wash your hands for a minimum of 20 seconds. If your employment requires you to go into someone else's home then the obligation on you is to ensure that you are well and not suffering from symptoms and the obligation on everyone is maintaining the 2 metre distance from each other. The Government also says that no work should be carried out in any household which is isolating or where an individual is being shielded, unless it is to remedy a direct risk to the safety of the household, such as emergency plumbing or repairs, and only if you are willing to go into that property to carry out those requirements.

Q: None of these rules really apply to me, do they?

A: Yes everyone MUST abide by the measures and the Laws laid down by the Coronavirus Act 2020.

Q: If I am caught by the police, there is nothing they can do to me anyway.

A: WRONG! The police, and other relevant authorities, have the power to enforce the Act where people do not comply with it. IF the police believe that you are breaking the rules they MAY do one of three things:

- 1. instruct you to go home, leave an area or disperse
- 2. instruct you to take steps to stop your children breaking these rules if they have already done so
- 3. take you home or arrest you if you do not follow their instructions or where they deem it necessary.

Furthermore: if the police believe that you have broken these rules – or if you refuse to follow their instructions – a police officer may issue you with a fixed penalty notice for £60 (reduced to £30 if paid within 14 days). If you have already received a fixed penalty notice, the amount will increase to £120 and double on each further repeat offence. There have been a handful of cases through the country where the offender has been taken to Court and received a Criminal Record.

LAWSHALL GARDEN CLUB: June 2020

June, the month of the rose. If you're like me and love roses, then this is the month you have been waiting for. Yes I know that some of your



roses will have flowered in mid to late May but it is in June that they come into their own. But the rose isn't alone in its splendour. Many other shrubs are also flowering now, including the flamboyant Peonies, the towering Lupins, fragrant Philadelphus and the delightful Dianthus to name but a few.

June is the month to sit outside and enjoy the fruits of your labours but there are a few things you still need to be getting on with. Plants need to be kept watered, especially in these dry conditions and they need to be deadheaded regularly too. I would do both in the evening when the heat of the sun has died down giving the water a chance to work its way down to the roots where it is most needed.

Now is the time to dig up your tulip bulbs to be stored in a cool dark place if you intend to replant them in the autumn. Plant out summer bedding now that all chance of frosts has passed and tidy up perennials after flowering.

In the vegetable garden you can sow a variety of things now including lettuce, spring onion, radish, carrots swede, peas and many more according to space and individual tastes of course. Remember though that vegetables will need regular watering and if you are on a meter, this can prove quite expensive so bear this in mind when planning and planting.

You can't call yourself a gardener unless you're willing to propagate a few plants of your own. Many people use the lack of a greenhouse as an excuse not to propagate but in June, there is no excuse and it makes financial sense to grow your own plants from seed or to take cuttings. Seeds can be sown direct into the soil now that it has

warmed up. Simply follow instructions on packets of seeds and watch them grow. It's wise to sow too many to cover for any that fail and to have extra plants to give away to family and friends or perhaps to sell at a show or fete somewhere (once we are allowed to of course). It is a good month to take softwood cuttings from plants such as Fuchsias and Pelargoniums too. There is so much advice available online now to show you exactly how to do this.

In my garden, I have planted all sorts of flowers and veg that I have managed to grow from seed including red cabbage, lettuce, spring onions, parsnips, sunflowers, cosmos etc etc. it is fun and rewarding growing plants from seed and I would recommend it to all of you. A packet of seeds is cheap so have a go and see how you get on.

Finally, enjoy your garden and if you have roses, look after them by deadheading and watering at the base. A good rose feed should also be added in June. Keep safe and well.




