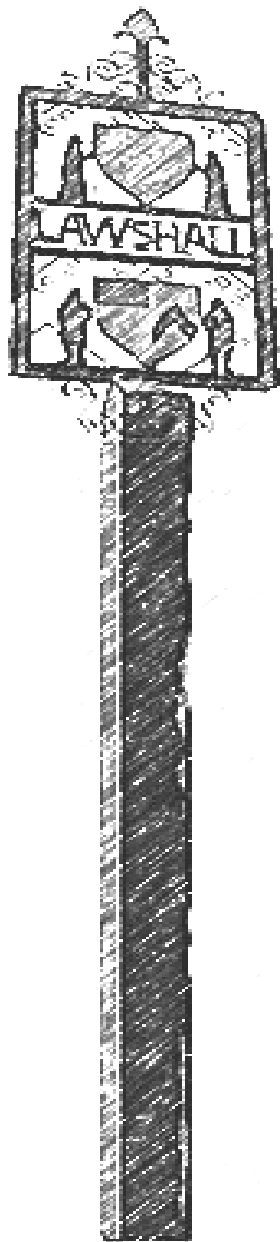

Annual Parish Meeting: Held on 10th May 2016. This was very well attended. The Chairman gave his yearly report. Reports were received from Mrs. E. Clarke (History Recorder); Mr B. Adams (Lawshall Trust & Relief Fund); Mr I. Carrington (Village Hall Management Comm.); Mrs W. Harris (Forest for Our Children). Also reports from Dcll. J. Long and Ccll. R. Kemp. The Accounts for the year ended 31 March 2016 were presented. There were no questions. The accounts were signed and adopted, this was proposed by the Cllr. J. Kydd, seconded by Cllr. D.C. Griggs, all in favour. The official unaudited accounts are available to view on the P.C. website. Thanks to Mr J. Parker for carrying out the internal audit. The external audit is in progress.

Annual General Meeting: This was held directly after the A.P.M. Cllr. D.C. Griggs proposed Cllr. J. Kydd as Chairman, seconded by Cllr. A. Irish, all in favour. Cllr. J. Kydd proposed Cllr. D.C. Griggs as Vice Chairman, seconded by Cllr. T. Elmer, all in favour. The Declarations of Office were signed by the Chairman, Vice Chairman and Clerk.

Verge at Lambs Lane: It was reported that this verge is still breaking up. The Clerk has reported this to S.C.C. and has been assured that this will be inspected a.s.a.p.

Bonfires: A report has been received about this. Will all residents consider the time of day/evening and wind direction before lighting any bonfires.

Litter Pick: The P.C. would like to offer their thanks to Mrs Paula Harber (and helpers) for her continued work in keeping the village tidy.

Party: Has been arranged for 12th June 2016 at the Village Hall to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday.

NH Plan: The Community Engagement Strategy has been completed. This was presented to the P.C. on the 10th May 2016. A Resolution was passed to accept and adopt this document. This was proposed by Cllr. J. Kydd, seconded by Cllr. T. Elmer, all in favour.

Suffolk Constabulary: Suffolk Neighbourhood Watch Association (SNWA) will now take on the responsibility of maintaining a database of Neighbourhood Watch Schemes.

Bird Notes June 2016 by Cliff Cooper

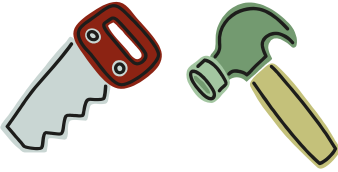
Sometimes things are not quite as straightforward as they appear to be. Take feeding the birds for example; fill a few feeders with seed and fat each day and that's it, all the nice birds will come into the garden and everyone is happy. How wrong could I be; we now have both magpies and jackdaws coming to the feeders on a daily basis. I wouldn't mind them coming if they just took the food we put out for them, but being the predators that they are, they also watch the smaller birds in the garden and follow them back to the nests- eventually taking eggs and even young birds. My dilemma now is do I allow nature to take its course, or do I intervene on behalf of the small birds and try to deter the magpies and jackdaws? Do I have the right to do this?

At the moment we have a sort of compromise in that we allow the magpies and jackdaws to take some food from the feeders and then shoo them away from the garden. The smaller birds and the starlings soon jump back onto the food and can get back to their nests unseen (we hope). Obviously, we cannot guard the garden all the time so sooner or later we will have more predation. I really don't know what else we can do about the situation.

Another little problem that has developed comes from the starlings. They love the mealworms they get each morning, seemingly taking some back to their nests. Unfortunately for us, one of the nests is in the eaves of our neighbour's house across the road. Guess what happens! Yes, when the starling parents leave the nest after feeding their young they either poop themselves or drop the faecal sacs from the young birds as they fly from the nest back to the feeders. Where does all this mess end up? Right again, it goes all over our two cars as we park them directly under the flight path. No solution to this problem other than putting covers over the cars.

If only life could be simple.

The project was huge, and the produce they were growing was far more than was necessary to sustain two Men, and so, Tim and Mark converted one of their out-buildings into a Farm Shop, half of which is a gorgeous cafe where Mark makes the cakes dutifully before he goes to work in the morning. Tim said that he, 'absolutely made the right decision to make the change, the job is hard, long hours and 7 days a week, but it is worth it'. As well as providing the local community with delicious food, Tim and Mark provide education and training to young people with Brain injuries and also put on training such as 'Pig Keeping' for everyone.

Tim then shared with us some treats from his shop which included, locally sourced creme fraiche goats cheese, Binham Blue cheese, smoked salmon and an unusual mango vinegar which got all the WI members talking.

The meeting was a great success enjoyed by all the 11 members we have got so far, very good for a new start up we hear. But we would love more members. If you're not sure why not come along and see for yourself. 'From the Archives' June 2016

One of our Lawshall residents recently shared with me some of his family history, including the time his grandmother Agnes Morley, lived at The Swan with her aunt & uncle Walter and Rebecca Cornish, who were the landlords at The Carpenters Arms and then The Swan. Agnes met Leonard George Snow who was a gamekeeper on the Coldham Estate. In 1924 Walter, who was also a carpenter, thatcher and coffin maker, retired from The Swan and Leonard purchased the lease for £34/3/4d.
