

Please take time also to read the important item about the adoption of the Lawshall Neighbourhood Plan and the putting in place of a new planning application process.





Just a Thought....

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. once said, "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that," meaning that only understanding can drive out ignorance.

God has revealed that, "He is light and in Him is no darkness at all (1 John 1 v 5). In contrast, by nature we are in darkness, i.e. ignorance, having become alienated from Him (Ephesians 4 v 18), so fall short of the purpose for which He made us. Jesus declared that He is the light that we need to drive out our darkness, saying, "I am the light of the world" and "I have come as a light into the world, so that whoever believes in Me" - i.e. submits their life to Him and His teaching - "will not remain in darkness but have the light of life" (John 8 v 12 with 12 v 46). God started the physical life of this world by commanding light to shine out of darkness. Likewise, spiritual life is started by Him giving light, that is, an understanding of His grace in Jesus Christ, to any who come to Him (2 Corinthians 4 v 6).

It is the entrance of His words into our lives that gives understanding (Psalm 119 v 130), which is why as an evangelical church we are committed to the Bible, as it is the main way by which God communicates with mankind. His Word is both relevant and trustworthy and is for all people. We seek to shape our lives by His teaching, both as individuals and as a church. Because of this, teaching from the Bible is at the centre of our services. Currently our service is from 11.00 to 12.00 every Sunday morning and we can pick up if required. We also run a "Little Treasures" Parent and Toddler Group on a Thursday morning.

With the warm weather comes the threat of pests and diseases. Try not to plant your plants too close together. For example, roses need space and air to thrive and don't like competing for moisture and goodness in the soil. By spacing them well, rust and blackspot can be reduced.

A healthy garden will also attract insects and other creatures that will control infestations of blackfly and other similar pests. Wasps will also feed on many of our common pests.

Things to do

- Feed containers with a liquid feed every week or two.
- Feed border plants and roses once during the month, to give them a midsummer boost.
- Stake tall border plants.
- Remove runners from strawberry plants.
- Remove side shoots from tomato plants and liquid feed once a week.
- Divide and replant primroses and polyanthus.
- Prune early flowering spring and summer shrubs, removing a portion of older wood each year.
- Wisteria can be given a Summer prune, cutting all the long side shoots back to 20cm, to promote flowering next spring.

Things not to do

As always try not to waste water and time in watering the lawn in dry spells, it's better to save your water for plants and veggies.

Whatever needs doing in your gardens, take time to enjoy them!



Lawshall Community Woodlands Forest for Our Children

With the woodland meadows now in full flower it is appropriate to consider some of the insects

that find sustenance in these all too rare habitats. Last year we looked at the dazzle camouflage of day-flying moths and



The most obvious example, perhaps, is the Cinnabar moth because many of us are familiar with the caterpillar which has bold orange and black 'rugby jersey' markings around its body. The adult's wings are glossy black with scarlet bars, making it unmissable and therefore extremely obvious to every would-be predator in the area.

The evolutionary development of this species has cleverly utilised the toxins carried in the foodplant of the caterpillars. This plant is ragwort, which most of us know to be poisonous, although it is a valuable wildflower hosting thirty species of insects that are entirely reliant upon it. In addition, it produces large quantities of nectar and pollen, so it has a lot going for it so long as it does not end up in hay that is used to feed horses and cattle.

The six-spot Burnet moth is equally striking, being black with scarlet spots. In the sunlight the wings show a metallic green sheen through the black which makes it extremely attractive. Once again, the defence provided to the adult comes from the caterpillar which feeds on trefoils which contain toxins. The caterpillar, having fed on the trefoils, contain derivatives of cyanide which they are able to release as hydrogen cyanide if attacked, which would be very unpalatable or even lethal to predators. Therefore, the startling colours of the adult moth serve as a warning to leave them well alone. At this time of year, the cocoons of the six-spot burnet moth can be found on grass stems in meadows, but their populations fluctuate considerably from decade to decade. I was fortunate to have them in my garden wildflower area for several years and hope that they will return.

The management morning on the last Sunday will focus on ride trimming.

LAWSHALL NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Following the formal adoption of the Lawshall Neighbourhood Plan by Babergh District Council on 19 April 2024, the Parish Council (PC) have put in place the following process for all new planning applications that will be affected by it:

- All new planning applications received will be scrutinised by a three person watchdog to assess the application against the 22 separate policies within the plan. Two of the watchdog will be independent of the Parish Council, with one sitting on both bodies.
- The watchdog will have received training and advice from the district planning authority to assist their interpretation of the Plan and the planning process as a whole.
- A report based on a standard framework will be submitted to the PC by the watchdog to accompany the full planning application for consideration by the PC.
- The PC will form an opinion of the planning application, informed by the watchdog report and submit their response to the planning officer. The PC are not obliged to adopt the same opinion as the watchdog.

In addition there will be a standing item on the PC agenda each month to focus on the stated Community Actions within the Neighbourhood Plan.





Bird Notes

Unfortunately, my prediction last month that the migrant bird numbers were looking good has not come true for some species. The hirundines seem to be here in lower numbers again this year.



There are only a couple of house martins around the Glebe, so probably only one nest this year: the swallows over the nearby fields also seem to be very few and far between: the swifts, however, appear to be holding steady as we see up to six flying over the Glebe quite regularly.

I really don't think the problems for these birds lie here in Lawshall, it is more that their habitats in Africa are changing through various

causes and they find it more difficult to survive over there, and the migration routes are getting too hard to manage.

One little bird did lift our hopes recently when we saw a spotted flycatcher doing its fly catching from the hedge on Walcher's meadow. I hadn't seen one of these beauties in the village for several years, though they used to be regular nesters in the graveyard at All Saints church (maybe there is still a pair there and I keep missing them as I walk by - please let me know).

From the Archives June 2024

This article is going to be about the Archives. In 1984 the Parish Council received a letter from the Suffolk Local History Council asking them to find a Local History Recorder for the village. After 40 years in this role I feel it is time to hand this job over to someone else.

In the coming weeks and months you will see the advert below on the notice boards. I hope someone will come forward. I know that the documents and photos and information about the village that I have saved over the years have been of interest to many people, and hopefully this will continue.

AWSHALL, if so, contact Elizabeth

The Suffolk Local History Council runs a Local Recorders Scheme throughout Suffolk. We administer a network of volunteers to ensure that the 'present' is adequately recorded at local level for the 'future'.

A Local Recorder will note significant happenings in their parish and collect their local parish magazines, leaflets, election pamphlets and newspaper cuttings. At the end of each year, they are asked to submit a short report summarising the activities of their parish. The reports are deposited at the Suffolk Record Office and available to future researchers together with the collected items.

Over the past 40 years I have had help from many people in developing a system of cataloguing, but there is still work to do cataloguing the remaining documents I have at home and, at the same time, trying to record all the changes in our village.

Back in **March 2012** the Suffolk Record Office visited to approve our method of cataloguing before depositing documents at the Bury Office. We were very happy to receive this acknowledgement from the Archivist.

"it was a real treat to see your careful work and obvious affection for the history of the village. In my line of work, I find myself worrying rather a lot about the Archives in private ownership, as they sometimes come to me in a very poor state and that makes me very sad. They are so precious, and people do not always realise that. I am glad I can feel completely relaxed about the state of affairs in Lawshall, I feel the village's heritage is in very safe hands!

Last month I gave my final talk at the Local History Recorders' Conference. The Recorder's Secretary said this at the end of my talk.

Elizabeth that was absolutely brilliant! You summed up everything that a Recorder is expected to do and you have done it for 40 years. You should definitely try to ease off and try and find a suitable person who can carry on doing what you have done. Congratulations on being able to get so many of the Archives into the Suffolk Archives and for the service to the village, I hope that the Parish Council recognize that this work has been invaluable to Lawshall.'



This photo shows some of your village records safely stored. I really want to acknowledge the help I have had and the ongoing help from Debbie Thomas, Miles Steeden and Sally Lane and others, I cannot tidy up the outstanding work without their help. Sadly in the future the Records will go to Ipswich which will make them less accessible, but I really hope that they will be safe for the next several hundreds of years!
