

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

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
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Lawshall Garden Club


October is, in my opinion, one of the best months, when the leaves turning colour adds another element to the garden.

However, there is always something to be done, especially before the winter sets in:



- Tidying the borders by clearing weeds and cutting back dead flowering stems. However, some flower heads can be left for the wonderful effect they produce over winter such as Sedums.
- Clear fallen leaves from grass areas and away from the crowns of other plants to prevent rotting.
- Begin the process of collecting leaves for making leaf mould. Ideally, leaf mould should be left for two years or more for it to become fine and fresh, but it can be used after one year. Two-year-old leaf mould is ideal as a mulch for healthy plant growth and for soil improvement. Mixed with soil, it can also be used for potting on young plants. If it is only a year old, it is best used as a mulch under young trees and fruit bushes.
- Pots for spring can be planted up this month. Maybe consider layering your pots for longer displays in the spring by placing larger and later flowering bulbs (eg tulips) towards the bottom, daffodils for earlier flowers in the middle section and perhaps some small spring irises at the top.
- Cut back roses by about a third late in October or early November to avoid wind rock, leaving the full pruning for February or March.

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

Lawshall Community Woodlands Forest for Our Children

At this time of year there is a change in emphasis in

woodland management tasks. Gone are the days of nesting birds and flowering meadows with their associated insects. Now the 'real' work of maintaining diversity in the woodlands begins.





beneath the thick canopy of trees overhead, and the woodland floor beneath would be almost devoid of any wildlife. This is where coppicing can make all the difference. Trees are coppiced at an approximate height of 30cm above ground. This seems very drastic but when spring arrives, the stumps sprout and grow anew providing they are protected from deer browsing. In this manner there can be an almost endless cycle of coppicing and regrowth over many centuries. Bradfield Woods has, or had, a living ash stool that was thought to be about nine hundred years old, although that is unusual.

In Golden and Crooked Woods the trees are not quite so old but perhaps some of them will grow to a great age if they continue to be managed by the community through the centuries. Currently, it is mostly hazel that is being coppiced. Hazel does not achieve any great size, and it is usually more of a large shrub than a tree. However, it provides some useful wood and regrows very quickly. Areas of our community woodlands are being coppiced for the first time since their planting but reference to the 1611 map of Frithy Wood shows that areas in that wood were coppiced on twelve to twenty year cycles as well as leaving standard trees for building. My house might have been built with a timber frame sourced from Frithy Wood, although it was recycled in about 1595 from a much older building.

This month's management morning involves clearing the cut hazel and stacking the cordwood so that it can dry out for a couple of years before sale.

From the Archives October 2024

As I was planning what to include in this month's R&A I thought that a lot of the archives are in my head! As is the case for all the people who have lived here for many years. Several people have commented on what a 'spread out' village this is and I must admit that because I lived in Melford Road until the 1970s, I didn't really know the Lawshall Green end of the village. I will be giving a talk on Saturday 5th October at the Village Hall and will probably then give an overview of all the areas of the village.





Harvest in the 1940s was very different. No huge combines with lights blazing all night. The lady on the tractor is Nancy Lay, she was the wife of the Headteacher at Lawshall School. Then the teachers usually lived in the village, but now teachers are bombarded with dozens of emails from parents every day. There are so many contrasts between then and now. All part of our wonderful village history.

Bird Notes

Unfortunately, we were unable to go on our family holiday at the beginning of September as we had both contracted Covid whilst visiting Derby for my brother's birthday. Once we started to feel a little better and testing clear we booked a little break in Norfolk.

My birding skills, for what they are, have not been put to much use recently so we were quite surprised to notch up a total of 79 species on the holiday. There were a few glaring gaps in the list where we had missed such easy birds as song thrush, reed bunting, yellowhammer, common gull etc.



However, almost everywhere we went along the North Norfolk coast we saw spoonbills - they must be doing rather well, especially as we counted 14 near Morston. Great white egrets which were a real rarity until recently were noted singularly in at least three spots on the coast.

I don't know whether there is any connection with my eyesight here, but we tended to see fewer species of the smaller birds - very few migrants which we might expect to see at the coast at this time. Swallows and house martins were around, but the only warblers we saw were a few chiffchaffs and a whitethroat.

The one rarity which we did manage to spot was an American golden plover at Titchwell RSPB. I must admit that I would never have picked out this bird had I not been told in advance that it had been seen the previous day on the reserve. The task of looking through lots of our usual "goldies" to find this one bird was quite taxing, but fortunately I had seen one years ago on the Isles of Scilly so could remember what I was looking for. Basically, it is marginally smaller than the norm and has a prominent white eye stripe.

All in all, a much appreciated few days away!

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

There are two trusts in the village administered by the Lawshall Trustees: The Lawshall Trust and the Lawshall Relief Fund. They each get funds form dividends on investments, which arise as a result of bequests of land and money left to the people of Lawshall throughout its history.

For example the Village Hall was built on "Town Lands" which was left to the village in this way.

The Lawshall Relief Fund exists for the following purpose:

"to relieve either generally or individually persons, resident in the ancient parish of Lawshall, who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress by making grants of money or providing items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the needs, hardship or distress of such persons".

We give thanks for the men of Lawshall who in the 16th Century started the Trust for our village.

The Lawshall Trust is still there today for those persons who need help. Over the years there have been many who have needed a helping hand, young people and the elderly.

Also any organisation in the village can ask for assistance, as long as it is village based.

Whatever help is needed, everything is confidential.
