





Just a Thought....

John Lennox, Professor of Mathematics at Oxford University made this interesting statement in relation to creation, "There are not many options essentially just two. Either human intelligence ultimately owes its origin to mindless matter; or there is a creator. It is strange that some people claim that it is their intelligence that leads them to prefer the first option rather than the second."

It's interesting to note that throughout the whole Bible, there's never an argument for the existence of God. In fact, one of the few verses that address the issue states that it is 'the fool who says in his heart, there is no God' Psalm 14 verse 1. But it reveals one fundamental truth about the atheistic worldview it's definitely mistaken. The atheistic worldview tells us that billions of years ago, a random chance event happened where matter came into existence. And through an innumerable series of other random events, over billions of years, inanimate matter evolved into the life we have today - nothing creating something - which does appear foolish.

But God has declared that, "Since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made..., so that we are without excuse" Romans 1 v 20; that is, no excuse for thinking He doesn't exist and that we're not accountable to Him. Whether we choose to believe it or not, 'each of us shall give account of ourselves to God' Romans 14 v 12, and be judged accordingly. However, although unable to settle the account ourselves because 'the redemption of our souls is costly..., that we should continue to live eternally and not see the Pit' Psalm 49 v 8-9, the good news is that God, in His great love for us, provided that redemption when Jesus died on the cross; He satisfied His justice by 'laying on Him (Jesus) the sin (and it's penalty) of us all' Isaiah 53 v 6 – that is, all who come to Him in repentance and willingly submit their lives to Him.

We invite you to our Sunday morning services which are from 11.00 to 12.00 to find out more about the Lord Jesus Christ and why He came to earth. We also run a "Little Treasures" parent and toddler group on a Thursday morning 10.00 to 12.00 during school term.

Lawshall Garden Club

As we welcome March, and look forward to enjoying our gardens, after the cold and wet of the past few months, we must remember to be **patient!** This is a time for preparing the ground for planting, weeding before the weeds get too established and applying a good mulch, to retain as much moisture as possible for the coming season.

If you have daffodils, which have finished flowering, just deadhead them. Don't cut them back until the plant leaves have collapsed as this will feed the bulb ready for flowering again next year. It is also the time to finish the pruning of roses.

Don't be tempted by garden centres, enticing us to buy bedding plants, it is important to resist buying plants that will not withstand harsh frosts, that will still happen this month (unless you have a greenhouse or conservatory to protect them). However, hardy perennials can be safely planted. Just keep them fed, with a good mulch around them and keep them well watered (if the weather doesn't do it for you).

This month is also the time to recommence mowing the lawn if it's not too wet, just remember to set the mower on a high setting. Rake up moss from your grass and sow grass seed, to rejuvenate your lawn.

Other jobs to consider: -

Planting of Lilies and other summer-flowering bulbs in pots and borders.

If you have a greenhouse, you can sow tomatoes, chillies, peppers and aubergines. Make sure that your greenhouse is thoroughly cleaned and keep it ventilated on the warmer days.

Scatter general-purpose fertiliser over flowerbeds and around roses, shrubs and hedges

As always, enjoy your gardens and take pleasure in the start of spring. Our next meeting is at The Swan, on the last Wednesday of the month (26th March) at 7pm, if you would like to come along and meet like-minded gardeners. Membership is only £5 per person per year.

From the Archives March 2025

Every year as soon as the Sugar Beet harvesting begins I remember my father going out to the fields when the crop begins to grow to single out the beet with a hoe. It was arduous, work, not good for the back. Dad would often come back wet and cold and I remember he had a hessian sack tied round his waist. I am sure he would have agreed with this quote from the internet. "Sugar beet singling has been called the 'worst of jobs'. The word 'singling' is distinct from thinning turnips. It entails not only the removal of all weeds from around the small plants as happens in thinning but it also requires the separation of a number of shoots that emerged from the multigerm sugar beet seed". The crop had first come to this country in the early 20th century



after a group of Dutch investors began offering contracts to Norfolk farmers to grow it to be shipped to Holland for processing. By 1912, they were satisfied the crop could be grown in this country and built the factory at Cantley in Norfolk. However, sugar beet did not become a staple crop in Britain's agricultural economy (and a must-grow crop for most Norfolk farmers) until 1936.





The two photos above show the beet harvesting in the early 1970s on Harrow Field, Lawshall. You will all have seen the huge tractors and trailers and lorries going to Bury, but back then all the farm equipment was much smaller. No cabs, so out in the elements all day, and of course, no night time working.

Bird Notes

February this year was mainly so cold, wet, and sometimes very windy, that you could have been forgiven for thinking that the spring weather was never going to arrive. However, during that miserable time, the first migrant birds will have already been on their way here to spend the summer with us - trusting that warmer weather and a supply of fresh insect food will materialise soon.

Among the first of our migrant species to arrive is the chiffchaff, which will be heard and seen in Golden wood by the second week of March according to my records in previous years. Some chiffchaffs do not migrate all the way to Africa nowadays, so there is



always the chance of seeing one in the winter, but it will not be singing then.



Another warbler that has begun the trend of not migrating for the winter is the blackcap, both the black headed and the chestnut brown capped female are staying permanently here in larger numbers. They, and the chiffchaffs, have decided that the risks of finding enough food here throughout

the winter as our climate gets gradually ever warmer (thus keeping insects alive), is a better option than all the dangers that a full migration involves.

I have not yet managed to see a blackcap here during the winter myself, though I have seen several resident chiffchaffs. Whether this is due to my lack of skill, the numbers of chiffchaffs being relatively higher, or just luck I couldn't say. I just believe that one day I will get one on the garden feeders in the winter.



The factory at Bury St Edmunds started operations in 1924, and has been processing sugar beet grown in Suffolk, Norfolk and Cambridgeshire ever since. In 1972, Silver Spoon was established as British Sugar's retail arm and is the branding that's recognised on supermarket shelves today. During 1973, the Bury Sugar Beet Factory became the largest in Europe when two new silos were built.

The Suffolk Wildlife Trust magazine has just been delivered and contains this information. The SWT is thrilled with the news that the UK Government has upheld the ban on thiamethoxam - a banned "neonic" pesticide highly toxic to bees, pollinators, and river life. For five years, the UK Government had repeatedly approved the "emergency" use of the bee-killing pesticide on sugar beet, at the request of British Sugar and the NFU. However following extensive lobbying and campaigning from The Wildlife Trusts - including a petition with over 300,000 signatures - the government has finally upheld the ban, marking an end to the pesticide's devastating impact on British wildlife. This marks a pivotal moment in tackling the sugar industry's reliance on toxic chemicals that are used heavily across East Anglia in the production of sugar beet, yet pollute our soils and rivers and kill countless bees and pollinators.
