Lawshall Community Woodlands Forest for Our Children

For frequent walkers in Golden and Crooked Woods, the slow rhythms of the year can be taken for granted as, day by day, the seasons unfold imperceptibly. For others, whose visits are less frequent, the changes can be quite drastic, but often pleasingly so.



On a recent visit to Golden Wood willow warbler could be heard once again after an apparent absence of a year. The meadows, ablaze with buttercup and ox-eye daisy looked stunning, although closer examination revealed many other species, as well as butterflies, day-flying moths and other insects among the flowers.

The small pond which had been of concern because of drying up is still holding a good amount of water in spite of the months of spring drought. The reward is that large red and azure damselflies along with four-spotted and broad-bodied chaser dragonflies were present in numbers on my visit. The latter male chaser is a very handsome creature with the blue pruinescence of the abdomen edged with small cream-coloured scallops. The males rarely rested because they were busy defending their territories against the other males. I sat watching the aerial combat and my patience was rewarded with a visit by a female of the species, surely the most stunning of all dragonflies; an apparition of burnished gold, a seemingly priceless artefact from the tomb of Tutankhamun, dropping eggs willy-nilly into the water before leaving behind the squabbling males.

On a more sombre note, some idle minded individuals decided that the removal of the information board at the Hauswin would be amusing. It is a pity that such energy cannot be channelled into somewhat more useful outcomes.

As always, the management morning takes place on the last Sunday of the month. All welcome.





As we approach the end of the school year, we wanted to let you know a little bit about what the school community has been up to and also introduce those who are new in the village to our wonderful school.

All Saint's is an OFSTED outstanding (Jan 2024) Church of England voluntary controlled primary school admitting children aged 4-11. We currently have 175 children across 7 classes. Each class is very lucky to have our experienced and talented teachers and teaching assistants.

Our children love to venture outside. So far this year, all of the children have taken part in Forest Schools sessions and each class has completed their step in the 'Seed to Tree' programme run by village organisation 'Forest for our Children'. Years 3,4,5 and 6 have visited Shimpling Park Farm as part of an annual programme helping the children to understand farming's role in our food production.

Sport and the Arts also continue to be popular. The children are able to take part in a number of extra curricula sports clubs and our ever-popular sports day will take place this month. We have a thriving theatre club which is currently working on its third production of the year and a pottery club run by local artist, Cally. One of the highlights of the year is when the children enter a piece of artwork in the village show - they all wait eagerly the next week to see who will get the first prize! Not long to wait now!



Bird Notes

Looking back to the lovely warm, dry spring and early summer that we have had this year, it seems that the birds have fared much better for their breeding. They were able to get nesting underway a bit earlier due to the more clement weather, also the insects started hatching in response to the higher temperatures. Last year it was so cold and wet that there were not enough caterpillars and grubs to feed the young birds. Last year our garden blue tits lost nearly all their brood due to the lack of food (I cleared Blue tit out the corpses of the poor babies and cleaned the nest, but there was no second attempt). A different story this year though - the first brood was a total success with many young blue tits being fed in the garden, and the nestbox is now in use for a second time. The birds in general seem

to be much more successful this time around.

We are seeing more house martins around this summer too. My neighbours on both sides have martins on the nest. They still won't use my artificial nests though! There is a small flight of swifts (up to six individuals) using the air above the Glebe and Walcher's meadow to gather insects. I just love the sound of their screeching as they call to each other.

The months of July and August tend to be quiet for the birders among us as there is no migration happening, hence very few vagrant rarities turning up unexpectedly. Also the resident birds are too busy raising their families to do much singing to give away their presence. At this time I use my garden relaxer and watch the sky, mainly for birds of prey gliding over. As well as kestrel and sparrowhawk, we get buzzard, red kite and hobby over our head here in Lawshall.



Lawshall Garden Club

As an enthusiastic but amateur gardener I have, over many years, tried to plan and plant my own garden, with varying degrees of success and failure. However, after all the hard work, the best moments are when I can just sit in my garden and appreciate what has been achieved.

I am currently re-vamping an area, which I have allowed to get a little overgrown, but I can already see the benefits of our hard work (I could not have done any of this without the assistance of my 'willing' husband). I am now more determined to get to grips with other areas in the garden that need revitalising! Armed with a list of monthly jobs, and things I would like to achieve over the next few months, it's time to put in the effort required.

Things to do

- Cut lavender for drying (choose newly opened flowers for the best fragrance and hang up in a cool, dark place).
- Plant autumn bulbs, including Nerines, Colchicums and Sternbergia, in pots and borders
- Cut back early summer perennials, such as hardy geraniums and delphiniums, after flowering for a second flush.
- Take softwood cuttings from shrubs such as Pyracantha, Cotinus, Hydrangeas and Spiraea.
- Feed and deadhead roses to keep them flowering strongly.

Things not to do

As always, try not to waste water and where possible avoid using sprays to control insect pests - let nature's predators help you.

Whatever needs doing in your gardens, take time to enjoy them!

Meeting with likeminded people at the Lawshall Garden Club meetings, is really enjoyable, swapping ideas and helping each other where we can, as well as organising visits etc. to other gardens or nurseries.

From the Archives July 2025

The Harrow Pub

It was great to meet and welcome the new owners of Harrow House last month. The last time I was there was on Friday 31st July 1970, having a drink before my wedding the following day. We once had five pubs in the village and this was the last one to close. Thank goodness The Swan has survived!

Just a few snippets and photos

From the Bury Free Press, September 5th 1891: 'Messrs. Biddell offered for sale on Wednesday evening the well known hostelry known as the Harrow Inn together with a lucrative baking business. It passed into the hands of Messrs. Mauldon of Sudbury for £760.'

From the BFP November 3rd 1860: 'Robert Bruce, labourer of Lawshall, was summoned for an assault on Mrs. Elizabeth Frost, landlady of the Harrow Inn, the defendant admitted the charge. Mrs. Frost said that he brought an empty bottle and demanded some beer. She gave him a glass of beer and he asked if he might be trusted with a pint, which she refused. He then shook his fist in her face, using very abusive language. The Bench said that the young men in that parish seemed bent upon such misconduct, but they were determined to stop it. A fine of £1 with 6s/6d costs! In today's money about £205, a lot for a village labourer!

This postcard of The Harrow was posted to one of my Cropley relations at Park Farm Sicklesmere (Rushbrook) sometime after 1910, it has a George V Halfpenny stamp.



The Lawshall Murder took place on **Monday 20th January,1851** and was reported in detail in both the local and national press including The Times. The event will always be associated with the Harrow Inn. Elizabeth Bainbridge, a 31-year-old dress and straw bonnet maker, was visiting her brother's public house, the Harrow Inn, where she spent time drinking with George Carnt, a 29-year-old farm labourer and lodger at the Inn. The couple appeared to have formed a recent attachment. She left the public house between three and four o'clock to return to her father's house across the fields. Carnt followed her to a pond at the back of Frithy Wood, where the murder took place. On **April 22, 1851**, at the Bury Goal on Sicklesmere Road in Bury, on a specially-built platform by renowned local builder John Darkin, the gruesome public spectacle of George Carnt's hanging took place in front of 4,000 spectators. It was a day out for people and I would imagine many Lawshall villagers were there on the day.

If you have any more photos and information about the Harrow, please could I have copies for the Lawshall Archives? I am sure the new residents would also be interested.
