






Just a Thought....

A lawyer once said, "An ounce of mediation is worth a pound of arbitration and a ton of litigation!" And given the number of conflicts currently in the world, and the great gulf there is between opposing sides, many mediators with much wisdom are needed to bring about reconciliation.

Likewise, God tells us, that because of our sin, there is a great gulf between us and Him, which it is impossible for us to cross on our own (Luke 16 v 26). "But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loves us." (Ephesians 2 v 4) has provided the mediator we need in sending the Lord Jesus Christ: "For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 2:5). In the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ He has dealt with what is so offensive to Him and which makes us His enemies, i.e. our sin. However, His door of welcome is only open to us in this life so He now pleads with us to be reconciled to Him (2 Corinthians 5 v 20) by coming to Him in repentance and faith. Jesus encourages us to "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many (after this life) will seek to enter and will not be able to" because the door will be shut (Luke 13 v 24 & 25). And outside of a relationship with Him "Our God is a consuming fire" (Hebrews 12 v 29).

We invite you to our Sunday morning services to find out more about the truth of Jesus Christ and the reason He came to earth. Lawshall Community Woodlands Forest for Our Children

Regular visitors to Golden Wood will have seen the various stages of progress in the building of the cordwood barn. The decision was taken to create this because keeping cordwood under plastic sheeting out in the open



did not always guarantee dry firewood logs.

The first cordwood was moved into the store at the end of September with further timber from October's management morning also stacked inside so it is already being well used. The exterior cladding of the store does not reach to the ground, and this is intentional to allow airflow around the timber to help it to dry out. We always aim to offer logs that have a minimal moisture content which means that a negligible amount of tar will accumulate in wood burner flues.

Great numbers of volunteer hours have gone into the construction. The addition of gates along with clear signage will signal that the store should not be entered other than by authorised volunteers, as there is a lot of heavy timber stacked inside which could fall if interfered with.

The Lawshall Community Woodland volunteers are particularly indebted to the Friends of FOC/LCW as their regular financial contributions have been put towards this project and a sign will be erected in due course to reflect this wonderful support. Green Light Trust also kindly donated the telegraph poles used in the construction.

On the last Sunday morning of the month we will be competing the clearing of coppiced timber and stacking any remaining brushwood into habitat piles.





- Check bonfires carefully before lighting, to make sure no hedgehogs or other wildlife are sheltering inside.
- Look after the garden wildlife, as winter approaches, by providing additional food and shelter
- · Clean out and scrub bird feeders regularly, to maintain hygiene

Bird Notes

Just about a week ago (it's the middle of October as I'm writing), I heard a chiffchaff singing, albeit half-heartedly, from a hedge near home. As there had been a chiffchaff in that area all summer I am assuming it was the same bird and wonder now if he will stay all winter as many of

his species have chosen to do so. Certainly at present the weather is mild enough to encourage overwintering rather than risking the long migration.

Because the weather throughout Northern Europe has been so mild so far, the fieldfares and redwings have not yet felt the need to come this far south. I have seen just one redwing this season.

Having said that about the weather, the small birds seem to be making good use of the garden bird feeders. We regularly have greenfinches, goldfinches, blue and great tits, wren and robin in our little garden. Some of them will have been reared here - in fact I have just cleaned out the nest boxes, which showed signs of successful breeding. I also closed up the entrance to my swift box to prevent the sparrows usurping it come next spring in the vain hope that the swifts will use it. Must remember to open it up again before next May!



Firecrest

One lucky, or very observant, neighbour had not one but two firecrests together in his garden recently, showing that it pays to be on the lookout all the time. Firecrests are very similar to the more common goldcrests, but have a very visible white stripe (supercillium) above the eye. An expert could also tell them apart by the difference in their very

high pitched call notes, but I'm afraid I don't come under that category though I have seen quite a few firecrests, including one in Golden Wood.


