



#### **Lawshall Community Woodlands Forest for Our Children**

With autumn now upon us our woodland thoughts turn to tree work. After many years of misunderstanding we now receive fewer complaints about the 'cutting down' of trees, which of course is a highly charged term to give to the ancient practice of coppicing. Cutting down suggest destruction while coppicing actually



extends the life of trees considerably, so long as the work is carried out roughly every twenty years. The 1611 manorial map shows the coppicing of Frithy Wood, while accounts from the fourteenth century suggest the removal of enormous amounts of timber, but the woodland still exists. Coppice stools can survive for centuries and continue providing wood products throughout their life.

The management morning at the end of the month will involve transporting the felled cordwood to the new pole barn where it will be stored for two years to dry out before being cut into firewood logs. The top-wood and smaller branches will be stacked as habitat piles providing cover for many small animals and invertebrates.

Next year the coppice stools will sprout new growth. In addition the woodland floor will be colonised by a range of plants responding to the light that penetrates as a result of the removal of the woodland canopy. It might look messy but that is what wildlife requires in order to thrive. Our mania for tidiness is definitely wildlife's enemy.

Recent management mornings have been very well attended, and many hands have made light work, so why not come along on the last Sunday of the month? Refreshments provided.



### **Growing seeds for turtle doves**

In front of you is vital conservation in action. This area of wildflowers and patchy bare ground is providing natural seeds for turtle doves, one of the UK's fastest declining breeding bird species.

When these small doves return in April/May from Africa they are hungry and need lots of seeds to eat to raise their chicks.

Supplementary summer feeding helps, but

Supplementary summer feeding helps, but wildflower seed is even better, so we are growing some here.

Turtle doves need low growing flowering plants with bare patches between them where they can land. There are some examples below, but turtle doves aren't fussy, they eat seeds from lots of different species of plants, as long as they have access. We know that lack of available seed is the main cause of their decline in the UK, so Operation Turtle Dove is working with amazing landowners, such as here, to provide the birds with the wildflowers and seeds they desperately need.



Can't see any turtle doves? They are a bit shy on the ground and do best with minimal disturbance. Lots of other wildlife will also benefit; bees and other pollinators will love the flowers and birds like yellowhammers will eat their seeds.



#### **Bird Notes**

September in north Norfolk, there's nothing better if the weather is decent. We are just back home after three lovely days up on the Norfolk coast with a couple of old friends. We did plenty of birding, but also plenty of chatting, mainly about how things used to be.

Over the three days we only managed a moderate tally of sixty five species - quite a few common birds seemed to pass us by (I believe all the talking may be responsible for that).

Hidden in that tally was a pair of glossy ibis, which we saw a couple of times as they moved around the marshes. These large (heron sized), exotic sounding birds are actually quite easy to identify, especially if you have good views and can see the purple green sheen of the plumage and the long, curved beak.

They have rapidly become regular visitors in recent years and this year in particular they have crossed the channel in bigger numbers. Their spread through France has been phenomenal and it look like we will soon have them as regular breeders here. This rapid expansion is similar to the spread of the little egrets that we experienced a couple of decades ago. Also the great white egret is becoming much more common here in England. This expansion of range may be due to our changing climate and the drying out of some European wetlands - I'm by no means qualified to say but it's nice to see them.

The other bird of note on our list was a pair of curlew sandpipers on the reserve at Titchwell. These little waders are a bit bigger than dunlin, yet quite slim with longer black legs and a down-curved beak, hence the name. The ones we saw were in grey winter plumage so no red feathers.

There had been a grey phalarope (a tiny, rare sea-going wader) on the reserve at Titchwell for the previous few days, but of course it had gone before we arrived!



#### Lawshall Garden Club



October is, in my opinion, one of the best months, with the leaves turning colour. You may be thinking ahead and want to plant up pot displays with winter colour, such as heathers, cyclamen, winter pansies and Skimmia.

Pots with spring bulbs can be planted up this month. Maybe consider layering the pots for longer displays by placing larger and later flowering bulbs (tulips) towards the bottom, daffodils for earlier flowers in the middle section and perhaps some small spring irises at the top.

You can also sow sweet peas in deep pots for early flowers next summer, overwintering in a greenhouse or on a window sill.

However, there are always other things that need to be done, especially before the winter sets in:

- Clearing fallen leaves from the grass areas and away from crowns of other plants, to prevent rotting. Maybe start the process of collecting leaves for making leaf mould.
  - Ideally, leaf mould should be left for two years or more for it to become fine and fresh, but it can be used after one year. Two-year-old leaf mould is ideal as a mulch for healthy plant growth and for soil improvement. Mixed with soil, it can also be used for potting on young plants. If it is only a year old, it is best used as a mulch under young trees and fruit bushes.
- Transplanting deciduous shrubs that are either in the wrong place or have outgrown their current position.
- Tidying the borders by clearing weeds and cutting back dead flowering stems. However, some flower heads can be left, for the wonderful effect they produce over winter in the frosts, such as Sedums.
- Cut back roses by about a third late in October or early November to avoid wind rock, leaving the full pruning for February or March.

Whatever you plan to do, continue to enjoy your gardens.
